Dear President Reagan,

Thank you for your kind award of the Freedom Medal to Mother. I have already been in touch with Michael Deaver and told him that Mother will be here in June, and that she will be very happy to come and see you then, and receive the award.

Meanwhile I wanted to get in touch with you about another matter. For three or four years we have been buying food to send to our houses in poor countries; namely, India, Ethiopia, Rwanda, Burundi, Haiti, the Dominican Republic, the Cameroons, Colombia, Guatemala, Honduras, Kenya, Peru, Tanzania, the Yemen, Bolivia and Brazil - wherever our Sisters are living and working.

We have heard that the U.S. gives a large part of its surplus food to charitable organizations. We know that a lot goes to groups like Catholic Relief Services, and other agencies which ship to developing countries. Most of these agencies give food as part of their development programs. We however take care of the neediest people who cannot take care of themselves, and who can never pay for the food and medicines we give them. We choose to work wholeheartedly and freely for the poorest of the poor who will never be able to pick themselves up, and who often die with less than human dignity.

We would be so grateful if you would sanction some of the surplus to be given to the Missionaries of Charity for shipping abroad to our Sisters in the areas I have mentioned. Would we also be eligible for reimbursement of the cost of shipping the foodstuffs you give us?

The Missionaries of Charity, Inc. is a Not for Profit organization incorporated under the Not for Profit laws of the State of New York. Our Employer Identification Number is 06-1013589. The Missionaries of Charity is listed in the Official Catholic Directory, and we are accordingly entitled to exemption from Federal Income tax under Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

I hope that you can consider our request for food favourably. Mother and all the Missionaries of Charity remember you and Nancy warmly in our prayers, especially at Holy Mass, and we thank God for all the concern and great help you have shown to us and our poor people. May He continue to strengthen and protect you, and may Easter bring you many blessings and fill you with the peace and joy of the Risen Jesus.
