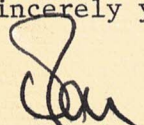

SUBJECT: Providence - St. Mel Fundraising Letter

At your request, we have reviewed the draft fundraising letter sent to your office by an advertising agency and forwarded on to us.

From the beginning of the Administration, the President has followed a policy of not becoming directly involved in fundraising activities for private causes. The President cannot possibly honor all requests for assistance, and support of one private cause will generate requests from other equally deserving causes which must out of necessity be denied. In addition, because of the lack of control over some fundraising efforts, Presidential support can be misused in a way that is inappropriate with or embarrassing to the Office of the President. Exceptions exist, of course, when the President has either a personal or an "institutional" attachment to an entity. An example in the first category might be his college; the second, the Red Cross.

The President has, through two visits, a video tape, and obtaining W. Clement Stone's aid in the fundraising drive, drawn substantial attention to Providence - St. Mel High School, both directly as a particular school and as an illustration of a sound educational program that can be an example to communities around the country. In view of this, I recommend that the President not sign a fundraising letter for the high school, but leave those activities to Mr. Stone.

If, however, a Presidential letter is to be sent, I suggest that the attached draft letter to Paul Adams, Principal, Providence - St. Mel High School, be substituted for the one you provided to us. The letter to Mr. Adams supports the fundraising effort and Providence - St. Mel High School but does not have the President himself conducting a solicitation.

Draft Presidential Letter to Paul Adams

Principal, Providence - St. Mel High School

Dear Paul:

On January 19, 1983, you honored me by asking that I serve as honorary chairman of a campaign to raise money for Providence - St. Mel High School for scholarships, operating expenses and needed equipment. I accepted with pleasure and by this letter emphasize that my commitment is to more than an "honorary" role. Providence - St. Mel is known as the "hard-work high school"; it's time the rest of us did some hard work to support your efforts that have made Providence - St. Mel a shining example to schools all across our country.

Providence - St. Mel stands as a testimony to your faith and dedication to an ideal I share deeply, that private initiative coupled with community involvement will solve our nationwide crisis in education. You took over a school about to fail and made it pass, with flying colors. For about one-third of the cost of a tax-supported high school, you have turned children from a high crime neighborhood into students with high achievement. That 100% of the 1982 graduating class went on to college is proof enough of the drive for excellence Providence - St. Mel instills in its students.

My two visits have convinced me that an investment in Providence - St. Mel is an investment in America's future. The parents paying tuition for children currently enrolled know this already; they can be proud of the fine education their children are receiving under your dynamic leadership.

But now is the time for the rest of us to join in the spirit of Providence - St. Mel and make your school ours so that we can share in the sense of optimism and accomplishment that flows through the "hard work high school."

I hope you'll be able to help us and I look forward to hearing from you. Anything you can do for us would be most appreciated.

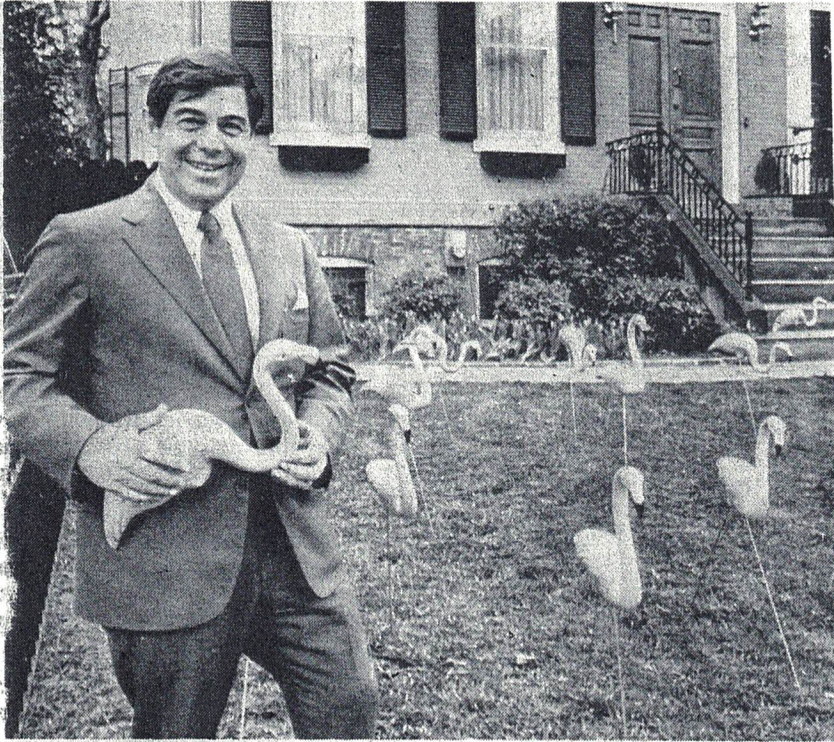

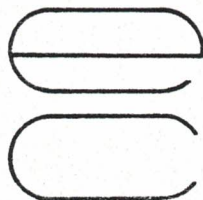

Through the volunteer efforts of young men and women of varying religious affiliations from colleges and universities in the Northeast United States, nurses, doctors, sisters, seminarians, and many other concerned individuals, we are able to comprise a staff of some 265 volunteers which is required for the successful execution of our activities. Their responsibilities during "E. C. Week" include counselors (one for each camper), waterfront, arts and crafts, horseback riding, riflery and sports adapted to the capability of the camper.

HOW IS ALL THIS POSSIBLE? It is possible because of the many wonderful people and organizations with whom we have been associated over the years...parents of our regular camp season, Catholic Daughters of America and the Knights of Columbus of the Diocese of Manchester as well as other Courts and Councils throughout New England.

WHAT HAVE WE ACCOMPLISHED? We feel that we have accomplished much more than will ever be realized. We do not claim medical miracles for these children and their illnesses, but we do know that many children have found new confidences in learning new things, in trying new activities and in meeting new people who are interested in them. Our camp is strictly recreational and it provides the setting for this and more, an opportunity for experiences the camper might not have had otherwise.
