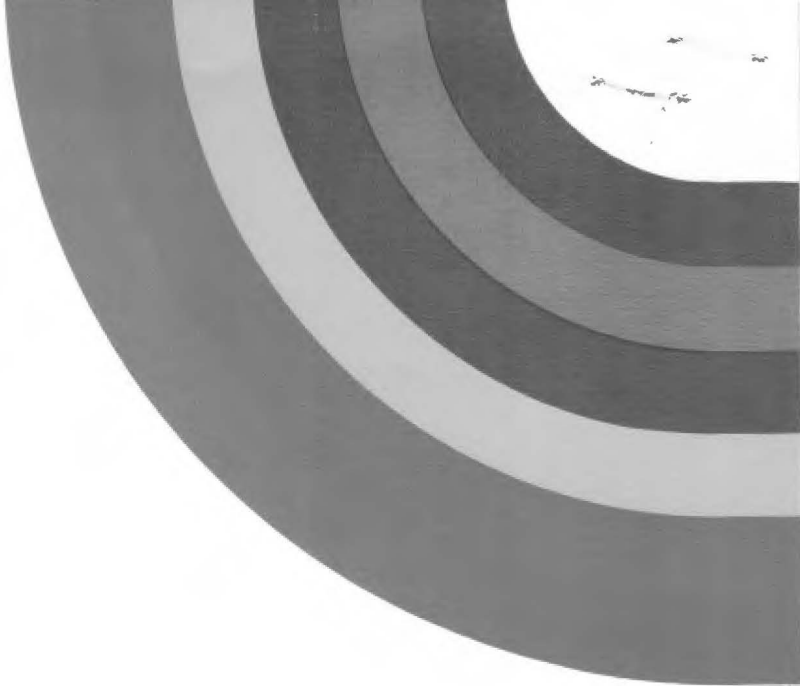

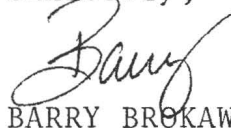

My first impulse was to telephone, but understanding the enormous demands the present circumstances must be placing upon your time, I am writing to share with you our shock, our concern, and our anger over the events of March 30, 1981.

Linda and I were terrified as we watched the televised reports of what has become all too commonplace in this country. We were greatly relieved that you yourself, being in the line of fire, escaped injury. We were very upset, though, that the President, Jim Brady, and two law enforcement officers were hit.

We know that these events have undoubtedly had a profound impact upon you, Ed Meese, and the rest of the Administration. We, too, have been deeply affected, feeling that close friends have been injured and wronged. We need by this communication to share our feelings and our prayers with you. Our hopes and prayers are, of course, for a speedy and complete recovery of the President and the others who were shot, and we would appreciate your conveying these sentiments to the Reagans at the appropriate time.

We only hope that these events will at most merely slow down the President's efforts momentarily and that all of you in the Administration will emerge with even greater resolve to carry on the work that you have so brilliantly begun.

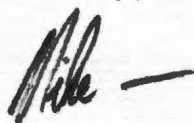
