Dear Micheal:

As I mentioned to you a month or so ago, David Lynch, the director who is currently wrapping up DUNE, Universal's big movie for this fall, is very much in love with the idea of being of some assistance to the President in his reelection campaign.



I rather believe it was caused by the mistakes in the spelling of some words in the telegram by the telegram authority, as shown in the attached certified copy of the telegram.

I would appreciate very much, therefore, if you transmit my best wishes to the President.

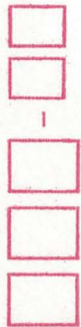
