Dear Mike:

This isn't from the Easter bunny -- but a not-so-secret admirer.

I've heard via the usual political verbiage that Greg Newell may be moving on to another post which, I suspect, is wonderful for Greg and his family but, in my opinion, a loss to our country. Enough of that!

I would like to share with you my observations concerning Allen Keyes, a man I became fascinated with while working at the UN. He is brilliant, brilliant, brilliant -- articulate and so totally committed to President Reagan's foreign policy that one doesn't have to worry about what he's thinking.

I speak now, in a very personal sense, for when he came to the UN his family did not accompany him at the time. For that reason my maternal instincts were piqued and he and I spent a good deal of time together. What a marvelous opportunity for this Administration to appoint so brilliant and competent a man who, incidentally, is young and black. Dear Mike:

I write on behalf of the Student Advisory Committee of the Institute of Politics in the hope that you will accept this invitation to spend two days at Harvard this month as a Visiting Fellow, preferably the days of April 29 and 30.

For a long time both students and faculty have wanted to find a way to inveigle you to come to Harvard, and this seems to be the right format and hopefully the right timing. Were you to come, we would make you very welcome and make sure you had an enjoyable time.

A bit of background. The Visiting Fellows Program brings individuals who have distinguished themselves in public life to Harvard for a brief but busy engagement with members of the University community, chiefly with its undergraduates. An address in the Public Affairs Forum is a customary highlight of such visits. Informal meetings and meals with student groups, Institute Fellows and others in residence at Harvard as well as participation in a course are other activities of the Fellowship. Among the former Visiting Fellows we have been privileged to have are Anne Armstrong, Art Buchwald, Judy Woodruff, Admiral Hyman Rickover, former President Valery Giscard d'Estaing, Eleanor Holmes Norton, Mayor Harold Washington, John Naisbitt, and most recently, Theodore White.

As you know, the Institute of Politics was founded in 1966 in an effort to foster interaction between the academic world and the worlds of politics, government and policy-making. Programs like the one for Visiting Fellows are designed to create opportunities for Harvard students, especially undergraduate men and women, to develop their understanding of the political process. The program is one of the undergraduate projects at the Institute. Once the Visiting Fellow is chosen, a committee of students works to organize appropriate activities.

As a Visiting Fellow, we offer you a stipend of \$500, plus expenses for coach air travel and accommodations. I hope you will be able to accept this invitation.

I would love to work out a way to make this possible, Mike, and if it would be helpful for me to answer any questions or accommodate any special requests, please give me a ring or have someone else do so. It would be wonderful to have you here.

Blue Tees 71

LOCAL RULES:

1. *Out-of-Bounds Areas* — areas outside fences bordering Club property; area within tennis-court fencing; at 9th hole, area beyond the line marked by stakes, and running from Southeast corner of tennis courts to left of and beyond 9th green.
2. *Ditch at 16 hole* is a lateral hazard only after it has been crossed.
3. *Roads and Paths* — ball may be lifted and dropped from surfaces and sides of roads and paths, within two club lengths of nearest point of relief.
4. Free lift for ball in hedge bordering putting green.
5. Matches may start from 10th tee only when #9 and #10 holes are clear. Matches starting from #10 and having completed nine holes shall alternate with matches starting at #1.

Groups of more than four players, single players, and players "cutting in," have no status as golf matches and must give way.
