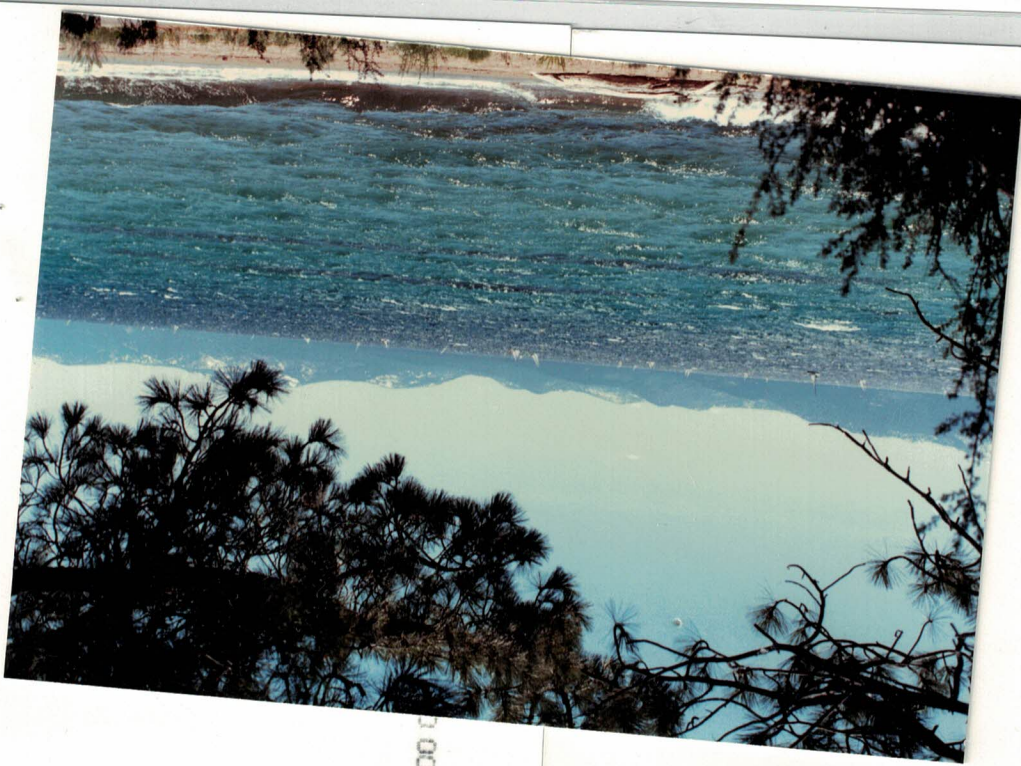

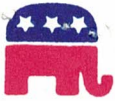

Dear Mike:

While I have been with the President on a number of occasions in the past three and a quarter years and on countless occasions before he became the Nation's Chief Executive, I recall in particular comments he made to me about you approximately a year ago while I was in the Oval Office.

We discussed television, in general, and made reference to the medium with which I have been identified since helping to place WGN Television, Chicago, on the air, April 7th, 1948. 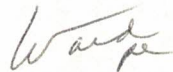
