H.R. 6142, which would expand the Secretary of Agriculture's authority to convert government-owned grain stocks into alcohol fuel, has been submitted to the White House. According to the Executive Clerk's office, the President has until October 25th to take final action.

When Nebraska Governor Charlie Thone was a Member of the House of Representatives, alcohol fuel production incentives was one of his major legislative priorities. In general--and especially in light of the current and anticipated grain surplus--the production of alcohol fuel (or "gasohol") is very popular in the farm belt.

We feel that a brief signing ceremony for H.R. 6142, done either in Nebraska or Illinois during the President's upcoming trip, could be very helpful.

With foreign visitors, budget review sessions, travel every week and the beginning of a lame duck session, I feel the President's schedule should remain as currently planned with the following possibilities.

1. Delete the minority business statement from New York. This should be done with a racially mixed group at the White House.
