SUBJ: POSSIBLE PRESIDENTIAL EVENTS - APRIL 20-21, 1983

As you requested, I have contacted various White House offices and I have received the following suggested Presidential events:

Office of Public Liaison

- 1) Meeting with Labor Leaders Regarding Defense Budget - Faith Whittlesey feels that defense is one area where we will have strong support from organized labor. She suggests that we pull together approximately twenty leaders of major labor organizations to solicit their support for the defense portions of the President's budget.
- 2) Meeting with Tuition Tax Credit Coalition - This is a small group of representatives of various Protestant, Catholic and Jewish Groups supporting Tuition Tax Credits. They would discuss the current status of the proposal and look at future strategies to gain support for it.

Private Sector Initiatives

- 1) Kick-off Summer Jobs Program - Jim Coyne suggests that we bring in a group of executives from corporations who hire youth during the summer to kick-off this summer's jobs program. Also included would be a group of local youth who benefited from such a program last year. This could take place in the Cabinet Room.
- 2) Meeting with Telephone Company Volunteers - AT&T and it's affiliates have the largest volunteer program in the country. Over 550,000 telephone company workers participate in the "Telephone Pioneers" program. While

employed by the phone company. They are given time off to volunteer their services in community activities. Most of them continue their volunteer efforts even into retirement. This would be a good opportunity to bring in business (AT&T) and labor (the Communications Worker's Union) together in a positive volunteerism event. As you know this is Volunteers Week.

Other Options

- 1) Economic Briefing - Craig Fuller feels that an economic briefing would be appropriate either Wednesday (after 4:00 pm) or Thursday afternoon for 30 minutes.
- 2) Spontaneous visit to the Washington Monument - It is my understanding that the President has expressed great interest in sometime visiting the top of the Washington Monument. A totally spontaneous visit Wednesday or Thursday afternoon would not only be enjoyable for the President, but would be a nice closing piece for the evening news.
- 3) Spontaneous Visit to White House Volunteers Office - Since this is Volunteers Week, a brief dropby the White House volunteers office in the Old Executive Office Building would be appropriate.
- 4) In checking the Almanac of Dates, we find that Thursday is "Arbor Day". This is a day where organizations all across the country plant trees. It is possible that such a tree planting activity is taking place at a local elementary school. If you are interested, we will look into what possible options would be available for a Presidential dropby.

SUBJECT: SCHEDULE REQUEST-STATE MUNICIPAL LEAGUES

Attached is a schedule proposal for the President to participate in a briefing for the Presidents and Executive Directors of the 50 state municipal leagues.

The 50 state leagues are affiliate members of the National League of Cities (NLC). The NLC leadership, mainly comprised of big-city liberal Democrats, has become increasingly critical of the Administration. However, the leadership does not represent the more conservative small city NLC membership. It is through the state leagues that NLC is able to maintain its membership. For this reason, the state leagues can have a large impact on NLC policy. Due to recent NLC leadership positions opposing various Administration policies, several state leagues have threatened to withdraw from NLC.

We plan to work directly with the state leagues in an effort to moderate NLC policy. The proposal for a briefing would be an excellent opportunity for the President to reach smaller communities and "grass roots" America who supported him so strongly in 1980.

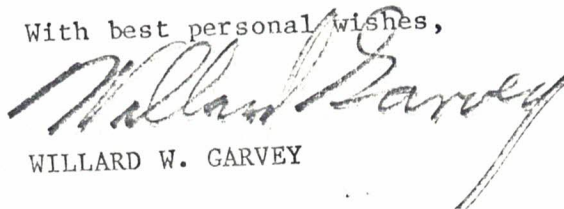
