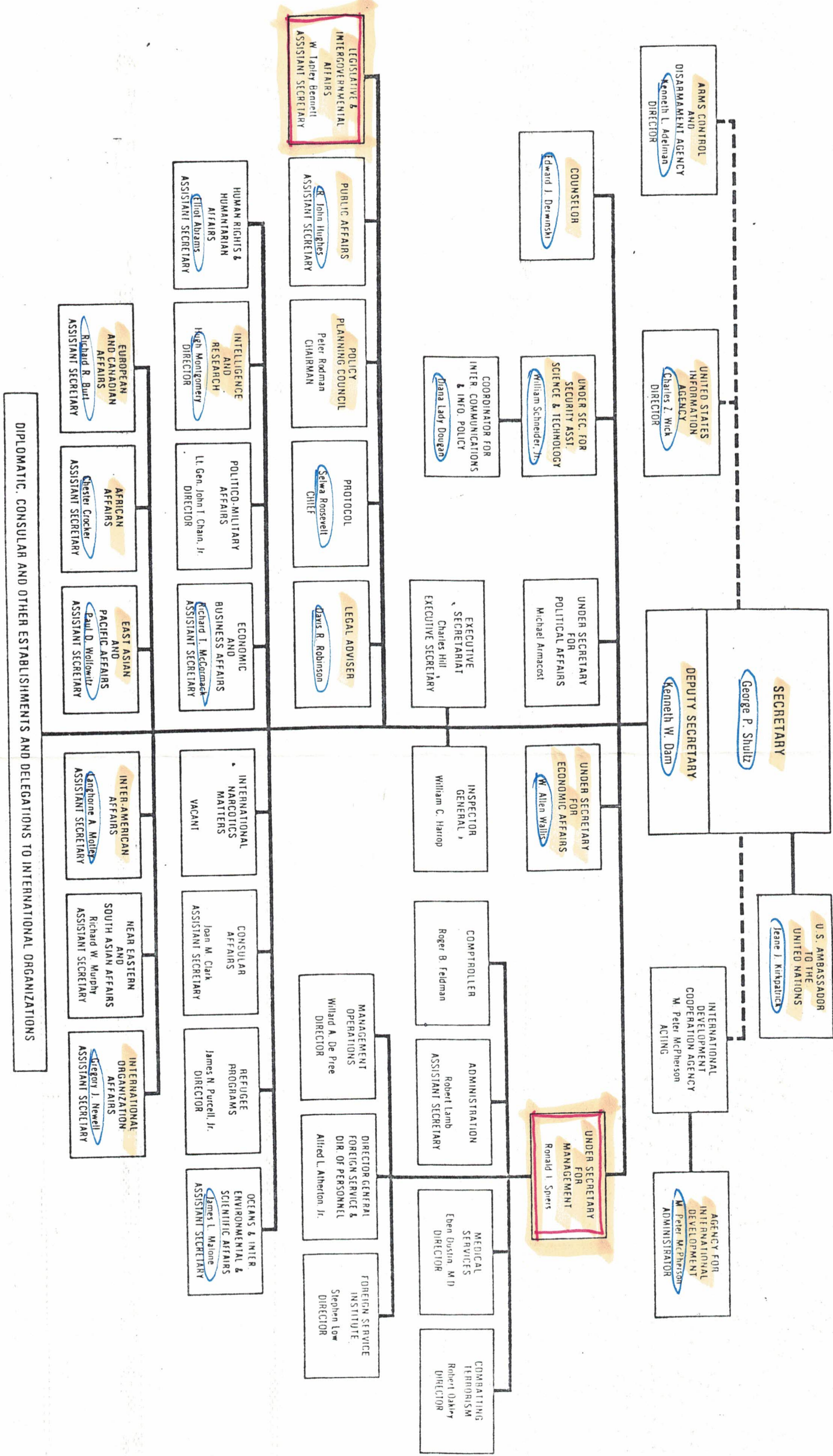

Dear Mike:

I agree completely with Fred Fielding's memorandum of August 3 placing restrictions on political activities of non-career Ambassadors. I would like to go one step further and advise all our non-career Ambassadors not to return to the U.S. during this period to participate in any activity related to the convention or the campaign.

I trust you will agree with me (and with Fred Fielding) that these Ambassadors remain full-time federal employees whose first and overriding responsibility is the successful implementation of their official duties. In this connection, I will ensure that no official funds are authorized for their domestic or international travel that is not clearly for valid official business.

If any of our Ambassadors (or other senior officials) are asked to brief candidates, political groups, or contributors, they will do so but on the understanding that (a) they are only to explain the Administration's foreign policy, and (b) their services are equally available to groups of both parties.

Obviously, career Ambassadors and senior officials are covered by provisions of the Hatch Act as well as the Fielding memorandum. They must feel themselves under no political obligations nor receive any political pressure to participate in any way in the campaign.

For your information, I have sent letters like this one to Bud McFarlane, Jim Baker and Ed Meese.
