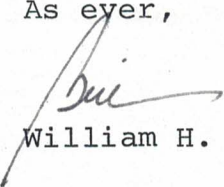
Seven years.

Not only did CBS News beat your brains in with "weighted" coverage on unemployment, but the President comes on the air looking like a "flasher".

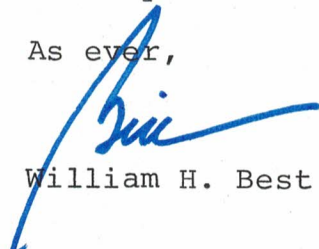

INTRODUCTION

The U. S. Government is the largest procurer of data processing equipment and services in the world. As such, the Government represents a target market of opportunity for companies that are able to provide computer systems on a competitive basis. JASON SYSTEMS INC. will be such a company.

The concept behind JASON SYSTEMS INC. is that of providing integrated computer systems based on the hardware manufactured by computer hardware Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEMs). The specific major market target will be new hardware procurements to run systems based on IBM compatible computer software. 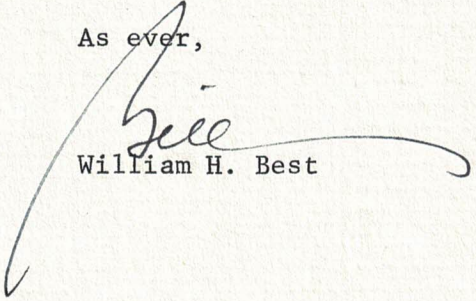

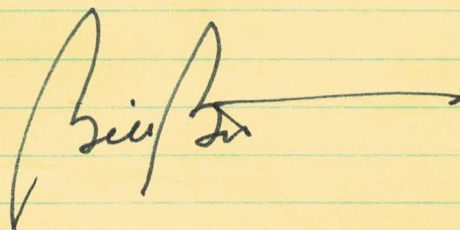
