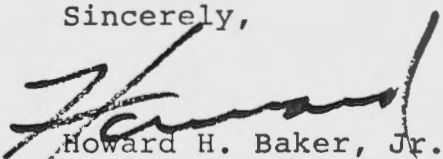

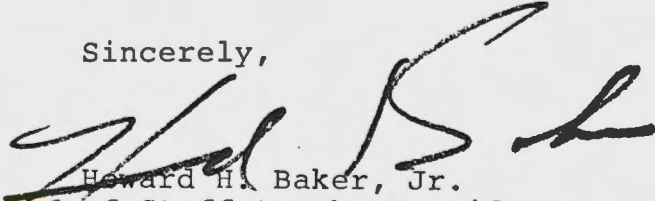

Thank you for your letter concerning the pending Congressional action on fiscal year 1988 appropriations for the National Science Foundation (NSF). As you pointed out, preliminary recommendations from both the House and Senate Appropriations Committees indicate that there could be an adverse impact on the competitiveness initiatives the President highlighted in his State of the Union address last January.

At one point, the Senate Appropriations Subcommittee for NSF considered freezing the NSF budget at the 1987 funding level. However, I am pleased to report that after we sent a strong message of support for NSF, the full committee restored most of the Subcommittee's ill-advised reductions. The full committee has endorsed the President's request except for a \$26 million reduction in the United States Antarctic Program, funded and managed by NSF.

The House, on the other hand, has reduced the President's request for NSF research activities by \$130 million with a number of specified research program funding levels. These program "earmarks," when taken together with the overall reduction, would not permit even inflationary increases in many of the other academic research disciplines that NSF supports. Although the House action is worrisome, we hope that the conference committee will provide NSF with a budget that is close to the President's request in all areas.

I share your belief that we must strongly support basic research as a key element in maintaining and strengthening our long-term economic competitiveness, and I agree with you that it's very important we make this commitment to stable and adequate investments in basic science and engineering research now. We will continue to urge the Congress to support both the priorities and the funding levels the President set in his FY 1988 request for NSF. This represents a commitment not just to NSF, but to the entire Nation.

I appreciate your concern about my health. I'm feeling fine now after a negative reaction to a prescribed antibiotic. Thanks for thinking of me. Warm regards.
