Dear John and Bob:

As always, I appreciate having your point of view on critical policy issues. I would guess that you are somewhat disappointed in the outcome of our budget negotiations, although the agreement meets many of the criteria you mentioned. While it may not meet your definition of "substantial," it is multi-year and, I would argue, credible; the primary one-time savings are asset sales, which make up only 10% of the package. There are real savings in entitlement programs, including agriculture, and real revenues.

It is not as much as I had hoped or the President had hoped, but is a good first step. Given the current composition of the Congress, there are only three basic alternatives to reduce the deficit. A larger package, as you accurately describe it, would have to include a limitation on COLA's. Whether that is a good idea or not, it is clear there simply aren't enough votes to pass a broad COLA change in either the House or the Senate. The second alternative is the plan that emerged from the negotiations, or something very close to it. The third choice is simply letting the sequester take effect and admitting that the only way we can deal with the deficit is by going on "autopilot."

I disagree with a basic theme in your article. You suggest that recent history has Congress waiting for "fiscal messages" from the President and shirking their Constitutional duty to legislate policy. I think that turns history on its head. The Executive, until the recent past, was the dominant fiscal policymaking branch. The President's budget was historically the basis for debate and enactment of legislation. Unfortunately, in my view, that is no longer the case. The President's budget is now declared "dead-on-arrival" while Congress scrambles to produce an alternative, increasingly ignoring self-imposed deadlines and failing to pass even the basic appropriations bills.

Of course, some of the impasse is due to legitimate policy differences. But, while I may be less than objective because of where I currently sit, having uniquely viewed both ends of

Pennsylvania Avenue I think the process is more to blame. I believe that we need to devise a way to restore the Executive to, if not a dominant role, then at least an equal participant in the budget process.

I am sorry that we were unable to do more in this package, but I hope that it is not the last word on deficit reduction.
