I appreciate your expression of willingness to serve on the National Economic Commission. Bill Schreyer has also endorsed your appointment. You are obviously well-qualified and would surely be one of our top candidates.

I must tell you, however, that I remain concerned about the formulation of this Commission. First, the President received only two appointments, while the Congress has ten. Second, the Chairman is elected by the Commission rather than being appointed. I worry that the political process inside the Commission in selecting a Chairman may be damaging.

Finally, I am apprehensive about any commission on the budget convening proceedings in an election year. Their deliberations could become campaign issues and affect the outcome of the election. Equally important, the candidates may be pressured to deny or endorse Commission recommendations, limiting their options after the election and potentially making the process counter-productive. If, for example, the Commission recommended a COLA freeze, including Social Security, some of the candidates may feel compelled to promise never to sign such legislation.

I continue to believe that a commission, properly constituted, could make a contribution in our efforts to reduce the deficit. I am not convinced, however, that this formulation at this time will produce a workable result. We are therefore considering what options we might pursue, including an attempt to negotiate more Presidential participation, Presidential designation of the Chairman, and convening after the election. For the moment, let me assure you that you will be on any "short list" we compile when the time comes for the President to make his appointments.

I understand that you had a successful trip to Nicaragua, and I am glad you were able to get down there personally. As you know, this whole matter will be the subject of further congressional action in early February. We continue to have daily discussions on this issue, and the President remains committed to a just and lasting peace in the region. As we pursue the achievement of democracy in Nicaragua and security for all of Central America, your continued efforts will be invaluable. I look forward to working with you, and I welcome your counsel.
