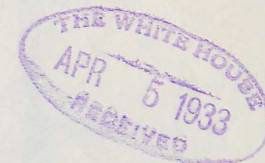

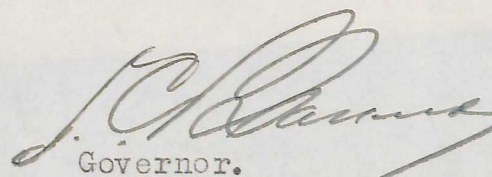
My dear Mr. President:

At the instance of my Jewish friends in South Carolina, I am joining with many others in an expression of my deep concern over the alleged outrages against the Jews living in Germany. This presents a most deplorable situation and, in my opinion, should be viewed with some degree of alarm.

This letter is written more as an evidence of my sympathy with you in your treatment of this important matter and not in the spirit of attempting to suggest what you should do. I am sure that your disposition of this problem will be as wisely performed as have been your performances of other matters of great importance since you became President. You have my hearty congratulation and best wishes in the things that you have promoted and accomplished to date.

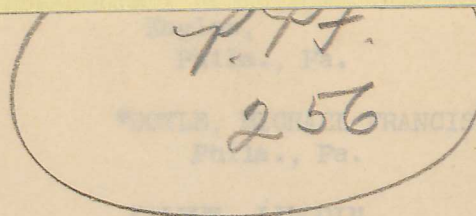

Asks that he be furnished with the most complete information available at this time regarding the probable federal set-up for administering the "Recovery Act" with particular reference to the possibility and practicability of State co-operation. Says that he is anxious that South Carolina shall leave nothing undone that may be necessary or desirable in order to facilitate and further the effective operation of the Public Works provisions of the proposed National Recovery Act immediately upon its approval.-- In reply the President advised him to get in touch with Sec. Ickes and Col. Sawyer. No allotments will be made for a couple of weeks.

JOHNSTON, Hon. Olin D.
Governor of South Carolina.
March 12, 1935

Writes the President that all South Carolina has been looking forward to him coming to their State since he promised his predecessor in office, Gov. Ibra C. Blackwood, he would do so when he extended an invitation to him last year. Invites the President to stop in Columbia, S. C., either on his way to Florida or on his return from Warm Springs, Ga., and states that he desires to have him say a few words at the dedication of the South Carolina Memorial Building. Adds that the people of South Carolina are behind him (President) in his great program of Relief and Upbuilding. --- The President wrote Gov. Johnston on March 19th, in which he extended his regrets but stated that he hopes, however, to be able to arrange to visit South Carolina next Autumn if, as usual, he is able to go to Warm Springs for a couple of weeks holiday the end of November. -- Under date of March 25th, Sen. James F. Byrnes transmitted a resolution from the South Carolina State Legislature inviting the President to visit South Carolina and to proclaim such day a holiday. -- Mr. Early acknowledged Sen. Byrnes' letter on April 2nd, and told him the President is sorry that he will not be able to visit Columbia on his present trip, but hopes to be able to visit South Carolina next Autumn.
