In token of our appreciation I am sending you a photo of the three Anders, grandfather, father and son respectively, whose ordination anniversaries we celebrated yesterday.

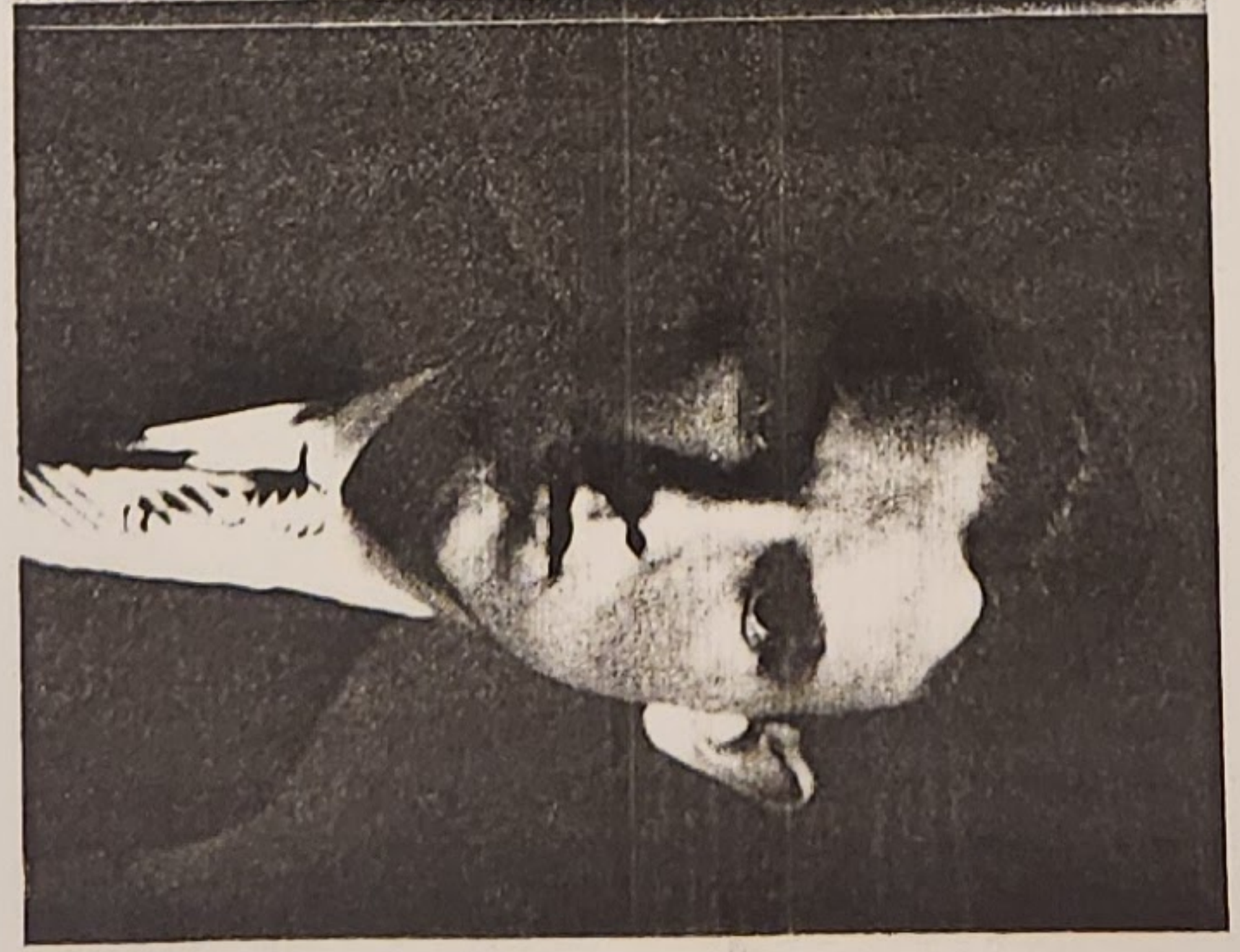
