Advises Mr. Early that on November 23d, the News-Press will celebrate the golden anniversary of its senior parent, the Fort Myers Press, and asks for a letter from the President on this occasion. -- Congratulatory letter sent by the President on Nov. 1st. -- Under date of Nov. 5th, Mr. Farley's Office transmitted, for consideration, a letter received from Mr. J. B. Hodges, Chm., State Democratic Executive Commission, Lake City, Fla., in which he informed Mr. Farley that the City of Fort Myers, will celebrate its 50th anniversary on Nov. 23d, and suggested that the President send to the Mayor his congratulations on that day. Letter referred to the fact that Mr. Hanton, called this matter to his attention. A copy of Mr. Farley's acknowledgment to Mr. Hodges, dated Nov. 1st, is attached. File memo. attached dated Nov. 8th, indicates that an inquiry was made of Mr. Linton Collins whether this could be golden anniversary of both the City and the paper, and upon investigating he advised that wire received said, "first wire will serve all purposes".
