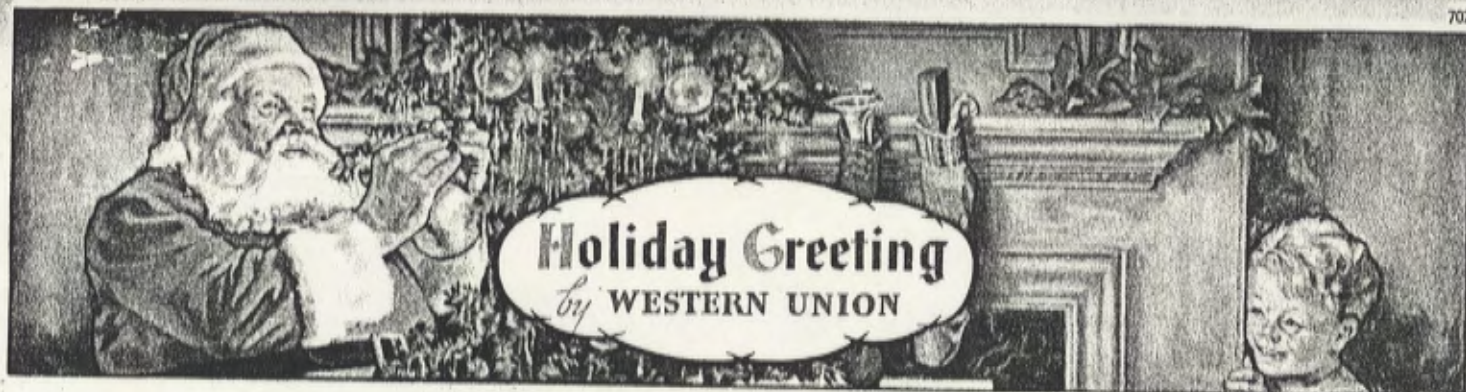

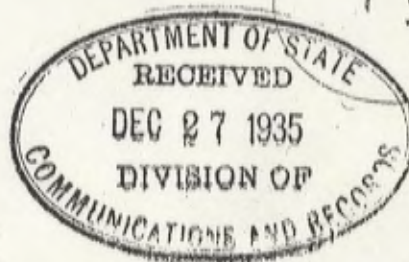

Stating they intend to offer them to the Fed. Gov't for a minimum compensation for their labors of 25 years, asking for a small advance payment and a yearly contribution in form of a pension to last for a period corresponding to that required for the completion of the works, leaving matter to judgment of Pres. States he belongs to the Order of Monks of Holy Mt. Athos, Greek Macedonia; that they wish to rebuild their Monastery, which was destroyed by earthquake, and for maintainance of the Fathers.

MEMORANDUM TO GENERAL WATSON

Dear Pa:

With reference to your memorandum of February 3, stating that the President has signified his willingness to see Archbishop Athenagoras and that you have tentatively set the time for 11 a.m., Tuesday, February 16, I have now received a reply from the Archbishop. The Archbishop states that it would be rather difficult for him to be in Washington on the sixteenth, since at that time he is to be in Chicago for the consecration of a bishop of the church, and asks whether it would be possible to arrange for him to call upon the President on Thursday, February 25. He adds that in the event it is inconvenient to be received on this date, any date after February 22 would be suitable for him to come to Washington.

The Archbishop further requests that he be permitted to bring with him three bishops, whose names I am not transmitting to you since I can see no reason why they should accompany Archbishop Athenagoras when he calls upon the President.

Will you be good enough to let me know the President's wishes in order that I may inform Archbishop Athenagoras.

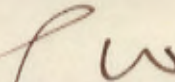

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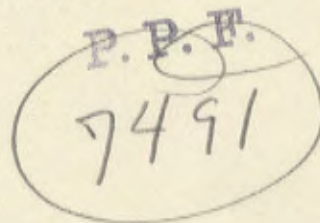

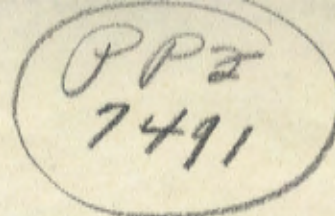
