Writes Mr. Early that he heard a rumor that the Newark jewelers' firm of Allsopp-Steller, Inc. recently made up 50 sets of cuff links for Tiffany's in N.Y. In turn Tiffany's was to forward them to the President for distribution as gifts among his friends. Asks for confirmation of this story. -- In a memo of May 18, Miss Leland denied this rumor, to Mr. Early, saying neither the President nor Mrs. Roosevelt ordered cuff links. -- On May 18, Mr. Early wrote Mr. Ring advising that he checked this story and neither the President nor Mrs. Roosevelt ordered the cuff links. This is entirely without foundation.
