3. PURPOSE: To review and determine, from evidence presented, the  
non-recoverability of the remains of World War II dead lost in the geo-  
graphical area described below:

a. Vicinity of Zeitz, (M-52/K-08) Germany. Case #2754.

b. Facts:

The casualties listed below were four of the crew of nine  
(9) of aircraft B-17-G # 43-38725, which failed to return from a bombing  
mission to Lutzendorf, Germany, on 30 November 1944.

b. Cpl Glen E, BARNES, 38 399 123, a member of Company "D",  
422nd Infantry Regiment, became Missing in Action in Belgium, and was  
later reported, by a fellow prisoner, to have died of Malnutrition and  
Dysentery, while being held as a Prisoner of War by the enemy, at Zeitz,  
Germany. The fellow prisoner further reported that the remains of Cpl  
Barnes were interred outside the city of Zeitz.

4. FINDINGS:

a. German Dulag Records KU 1139 and KUA 1139, records the  
entire crew by name; four (4) as captured, while no notation is  
made to the fate of the remainder of the crew. The remains of two of

the crew were recovered from this location, and were interred in USMC Neuville, since repatriated to the United States.

b. Several unknowns were recovered from Zeitz, most of which have been identified. Five remains have been turned over to the Belgians, as Non-American, and the remaining unresolved unknown has been declared Unidentifiable.

c. This case was placed on the Deferred Search Agenda, pending entry into the Russian Zone. Upon entry, the area of Zeitz was found to be in a forbidden area, however, the Russians agreed to make a search, which proved negative. (See Negative statement)

d. Reference is made to OQMG Forms 371, MACR #111149, German Dulag Records KUA and KU #1139, Memorandum: Report of Death, dated 15 August 1945, After Action Report, on file in the Office of The Quartermaster General, Washington, D. C.

e. Reference is also made to Negative Statement, dated 21 May 1951, attached.

5. RECOMMENDATION: That the remains of the deceased herein considered, be determined Non-Recoverable.

The plane sustained damage from enemy anti-aircraft fire over the target, and left the formation with the right wing in flames. Two parachutes were seen to emerge.

3. Sgt John M. Flynn, top turret gunner aboard the subject plane, a liberated prisoner of war, states that he witnessed the deaths of the persons named in paragraph 1 on 30 November 1944 over Germany. In each case he states that the cause of death was ~~xxx~~ enemy flak which blew up the ship.

4. A letter from the American Red Cross, National Headquarters, dated 9 July 1945, AG 704 (9 Jul 45) De Marco, Anthony R. 31329345, contains the following pertinent information:

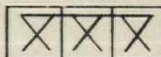

REMARKS:

Aircraft 43-38725 was hit by flak at instant of bombs away. A large hole was observed between #3 and #4 engine. Entire right wing burst into flames. and aircraft peeled off to right and lost altitude rapidly. Aircraft was not out of control and some crews report 1-2 chutes, though the majority saw no chutes. 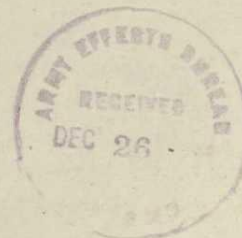


