Your attention is invited to the enclosed copy of an Act of Congress approved March 2, 1929, entitled an Act "To enable the mothers and widows of the deceased soldiers, sailors and marines of the American forces now interred in the cemeteries of Europe to make a pilgrimage to these cemeteries".

The records of this office show that you are the brother of the late Private George Abicht, Co. L, 16th Inf., whose remains are now interred in the Meuse-Argonne Amer. Cem., Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Meuse, France.

Will you please advise this office whether or not he is survived by a mother or widow who is entitled under the provisions of the above quoted Act, to make the pilgrimage, and if so, will you please furnish the full names and addresses of the mother and widow in order that action may be taken to extend invitations to them to make the pilgrimage. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, division, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

Disposition of Remains.

1. Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of March 23, 1922, stating that you desire the remains of your late brother, Private George Abicht, Company L, 16th Infantry, returned to this country for final burial. In reply thereto this office regrets to advise you that it is now too late to comply with this request, as our records contain your previous request that the remains of the deceased be left in France for permanent burial and instructions were issued accordingly.
2. The Secretary of War designated August 15, 1921 as the date beyond which no changes in requests, relative to the return of a body, would be considered. This date was delayed as long as possible in view of the progress of the work in France and after being made was given wide publicity through the newspapers and other available agencies in an effort to advise all interested. It is in view of this policy that the above decision is necessary.
3. The American Cemetery of the Meuse-Argonne, Romagnous-Montfaucon, Department of Meuse, in which the remains of your brother are interred, is a permanent American cemetery and the grave will be marked by a suitable headstone and will be perpetually cared for by the United States Government in a careful and reverent manner.

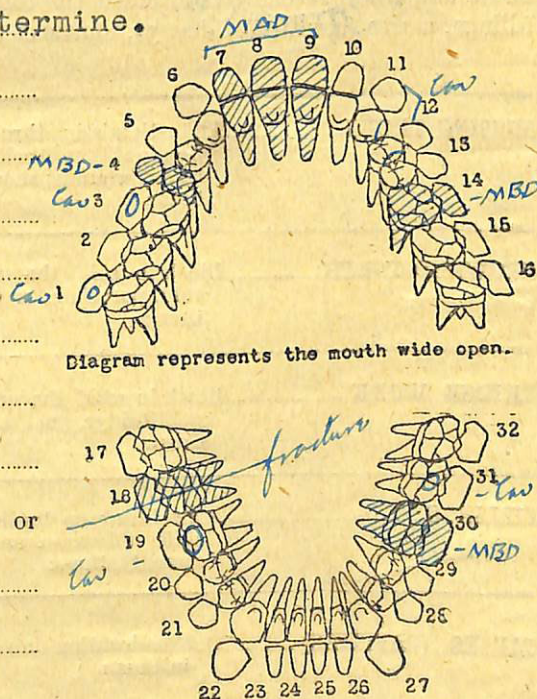

Enter information, as noted below, on reverse side of sheet in the *corresponding numbered space*. This form is supplemental to and is to be forwarded with G. R. S. Form 1-a, reporting reburial locations. To be used in answer to Question 26, Form 114, in case no means of identification on body.

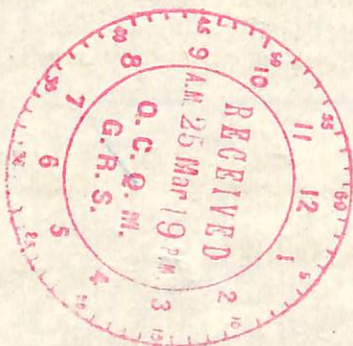

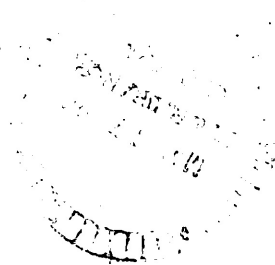
