Dear Madam:

The Act of Congress of March 2, 1929, as amended May 15, 1930, authorizes pilgrimages to the cemeteries Of Europe during the years 1930, 1931, 1932 and 1933 for the mothers and widows of deceased members of the American forces who were lost or buried at sea or whose remains are interred in Europe.

Your attention is particularly invited to the fact that this is the last opportunity you will have to make the pilgrimage under the provisions of the above mentioned Act. Unless you take advantage of this LAST chance to make a trip in 1933 you will receive no benefit from the Act. There is no provision of law which will permit the Government to make a money allowance to any mother or widow who does not choose to make the pilgrimage.

IT IS REQUESTED THAT YOU GIVE THE MATTER YOUR MOST CAREFUL CONSIDERATION BEFORE REACHING A DECISION, BEARING IN MIND THAT THIS IS THE LAST OPPORTUNITY YOU WILL HAVE TO MAKE THE TRIP AT GOVERNMENT EXPENSE.

In order to assure proper and satisfactory accommodations for the mothers and widows making the journey in 1933, reservations for steamship transportation must be made by this office several months in advance. It is requested that you answer the questions below by writing "Yes" or "No" or "Undecided" in the blank space following the question. When you have answered the question, sign your name and return this sheet in the enclosed addressed envelope which requires no postage. PLEASE DO NOT DELAY, as it is essential that the information be in this office promptly.

The Quartermaster General desires that you be informed that the permanent grave of 1st Lieutenant Henry G. Adams, Medical Corps, is Grave 6, Row 32, Block E, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, Romagne-sous-Montfaucon (Meuse), France.

This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, division, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.





1. Why was this body returned? Back in the early part of this year, I remember distinctly that Mr. Seigel was looking for Form-129 and letter forwarding same—due to telephone call from Hoboken asking what action had been taken on this case as Form-129 for body to remain was sent in December. We had no record of the Form-129 coming in nor of the letter enclosing same. Mr. Seigel searched and searched and found the letter from Hoboken forwarding the Form-129 on this man but could not find the form itself, so we cabled Europe to re-bury since the bodies from Cty. 510 were in storage at Bazoilles on 3/15/21. (See cable #734—dated 3/31/21) Copy of cable #722-2-A referred to also enclosed—see underlined. Do you suppose Europe did not understand our cable # 734 which says concentrate and not rebury as cable #722-2-A did? So far we have no record of it being received too late. I have searched Europe's letters and also the cables for any record. Europe could have reburied this body since the same was not returned until 8/6/21/ (Others were returned 5/3/21), and also up into April all bodies were at Cherbourg. Then this one body was sent to Antwerp, as one body was in storage there on 7/20/21 and 8/1/21. Relatives on December 30th, were told the body would remain. No notification of arrival has been sent, as Form 115 was returned by Hoboken 8/24/21 "Body definitely determined to remain."

2. I would suggest sending the body back, as there is a possibility of the mother not wanting the body, and we do not want another Neubauer case.




