

Adams, and record has been made of your desire that the remains of this soldier be permanently interred in France.
- 2. The cemetery in which the remains of this soldier are now interred is an American Cometery under the charge of the Graves Registration Service in Europe. Plans have not yet been completed concerning the final disposition of the remains of those of our dead who are to be permanently interred in France but it is assumed that all will be transferred to one of several concentration cemeteries yet to be established where the graves will always remaind under the supervision of the United States Government and the cometery will be maintained as our-National Cometeries in the United States are now maintained.
