Your letter of May 8, 1930, addressed to the United States Veterans Bureau, relative to the pilgrimage authorized by Congress in the Act approved March 2, 1929, has been referred to this office for reply.

For your information there is enclosed herewith a copy of the Act of March 2, 1929, together with a copy of the amendment thereto approved May 15, 1930, authorizing pilgrimages to be made to Europe by the mothers and widows of deceased members of the American forces whose remains are interred in Europe or lost at sea.

It has been held that Section 2 (g) of the Act which reads "Suitable transportation * * shall be furnished each mother or widow included in any pilgrimage for the entire distance at sea and on land and while sojourning in Europe and while en route in the United States from home to port and from port to home", limits the mothers and widows eligible to make the pilgrimage to those who are residents of the United States.

In view of the foregoing, you are not eligible under the law to make this pilgrimage at the expense of the Government.

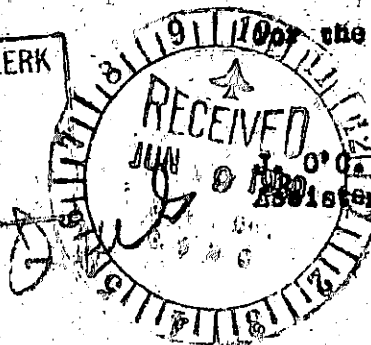

The Quartermaster General desires that receipt be acknowledged of your letter of July 19th, 1924.

It is regretted to have to inform you that the Department cannot now favorably consider the request of your parents in Poland, for the shipment of the remains of the late Private Philip Adell, to them for final burial. The Secretary of War has ruled that no original requests for the disposition of the remains of our soldier dead, would be accepted after April 1st, 1922. Fixing this date was deferred to the last moment practicable and was not determined until nearly three and a half years after cessation of hostilities. Such a decision was made necessary by the progress of the work of returning remains and of removals to permanent American cemeteries abroad.

Should your parents desire shipment of the remains to them at private expense, the Department will gladly consent to this action.

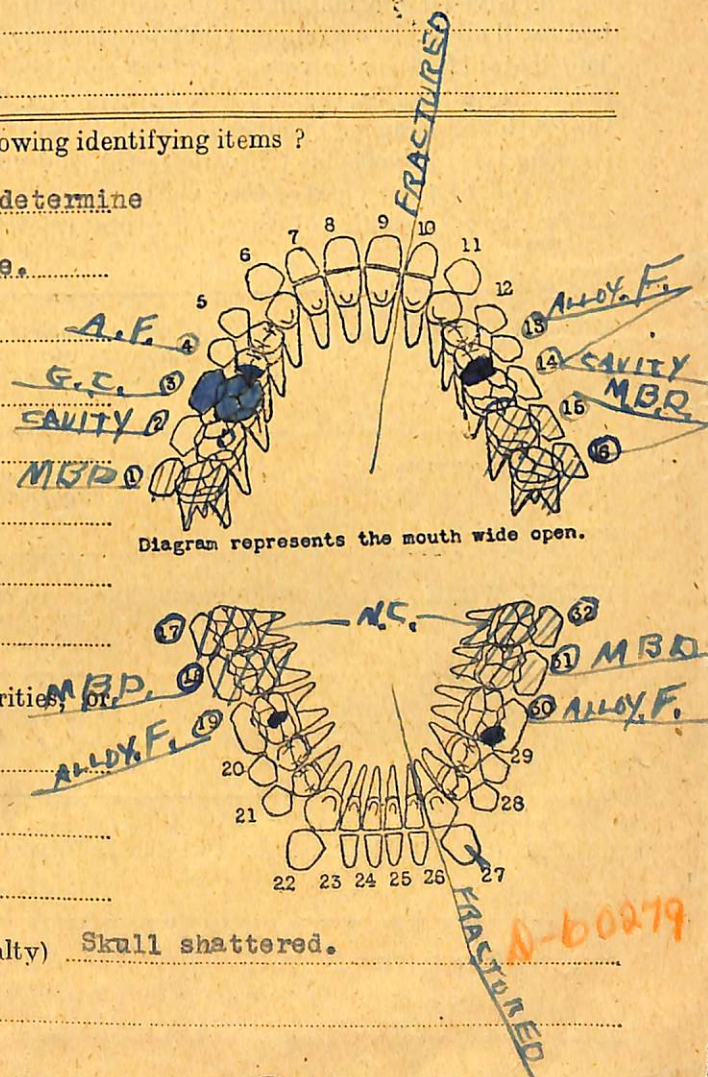

Replying to notation on "Shipping Inquiry" form recently returned by you, it is regretted to inform you that it is impossible to comply with your request that body of your brother, the late Private Phillip Adell, remain in cemetery for one year as it will be necessary at completion of operations to place it in a concentration cemetery in some other part of France if not removed from that country.

It is therefore, necessary that you obtain from your parents a signed statement indicating their wishes as to whether they desire the body to remain buried in France or to be brought to the United States and delivered to relatives or buried in Arlington National Cemetery, Virginia, or that it be delivered to them in Poland.

If your parents desire body shipped to them in Poland it is requested that you inform them that such transfer will be subject to the health regulations and sanitation laws of France and Poland, and any intervening countries through which the body may have to pass en route, and should the operation of such instrumentalities prevent the removal of the body in the manner desired, it will remain in the care and custody of the American Graves Registration Service in Europe, and will be cared for under the supervision of this Government.
