Dear Sir:

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of April 22nd furnishing the date of death of the mother of the late Private first class Maurice W. Akabas, whose remains are interred in the Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery in Europe. Your kindness in furnishing this information is very much appreciated.

The Act of March 2, 1929, as amended May 15, 1930, provides for pilgrimages to be made to the cemeteries of Europe by only the mothers and widows of deceased members of the American forces. There is no provision of law which would permit the next of kin to a deceased veteran to make the journey in the event the veteran is not survived by a mother or widow.

It is therefore regretted to advise that you and Mrs. Morris are not eligible to visit the grave of the late Private Akabas at the expense of the Government. Your desire to make the journey is understood and appreciated. However, the War Department has no alternative other than to carry out the law as passed by Congress.

Dear Madam:

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of January 22, 1930, relative to your desire to make the pilgrimage to the cemeteries in Europe, authorized by Congress in the Act of March 2, 1929, copy of which is inclosed for your information. *→ New Civil Div.*

You will note that Section 1 of the inclosed Act provides that invitations for a pilgrimage shall be extended the mothers and widows of members of the military or naval forces of the United States whose remains are now interred in the cemeteries in Europe, but it does not contain any provision which will permit of anyone else making the pilgrimage where the mother is deceased and there is no widow.

It is therefore regretted to have to advise that you are ineligible within the meaning of the law to make this pilgrimage at the expense of the Government.

The Quartermaster General desires that you be informed that the permanent grave of the late Private Maurice W. Akabas, Hdqr. Co., 143rd Infantry, is Grave 4, Row 18, Block A, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Department of Meuse, France.

This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.



