Information has been received in this office which indicates that you stood in loco parentis to your brother, the late Private, first class, Arthur N. Akerson.

An Act of Congress, dated March 2, 1929, as amended May 15, 1930, provides for pilgrimages to be made for the cemeteries of Europe by mothers and widows of deceased members of the American forces whose remains are interred in Europe or were lost at sea. The only provision of the law under which anyone other than the mother or widow could be considered for this privilege is contained in section 4 (a) of the Act, as amended, which reads in part as follows: "or any woman who stood in loco parentis to a deceased member of the military or naval forces for a period of not less than five years at any time prior to the soldier, sailor, or marine becoming eighteen years of age".

In order to satisfy the legal requirements, it will be necessary for you to furnish as proof of the relationship, in loco parentis, the affidavits of at least two persons not related to you.

In the event you believe yourself eligible under this provision of the law to make a pilgrimage, it is requested that the enclosed forms be completed and returned to this office, in order that your eligibility, under the Act, may be determined. Under paragraphs 1 (c) and 1 (d), sufficient information should be included to permit an intelligible decision as to eligibility.





Diagram represents the mouth wide open.


