Dear Madam:

There are enclosed herewith two tags and four identification pasters which have been prepared for the purpose of protecting your baggage while in transit, and to insure its safe arrival at the hotel where you are to stop in New York City. Please attach the tags to the handle of each piece of your baggage and place a paster on each end of each piece of your baggage before leaving your home.

Upon your arrival in New York City, you will be met at the railroad station by an Army Officer who will be in uniform. During your sojourn in New York before sailing for Europe, and upon your return from Europe, you will stop at the Hotel Astor, 45th Street and Broadway, New York City.

All mail intended to reach you between June 24th, 1931, the day you sail from the United States, and July 16th, 1931, the day you leave Europe, should be addressed to you in orre of American Pilgrimage, 146 Avenue des Champs Elysces, Paris, France; for example:

In making reservations for your journey home from New York City, it is necessary for this office to furnish the railroads with the exact time and date of your departure. The party you are to travel with will be disbended in New York City on the day following your return from Europe and all arrangements for your accommodation will be made with the railroads by this office accordingly. Upon your return from Europe, it will therefore be necessary for you to remain in the hotel over night as a guest of the United States Government.

There is also enclosed herewith information relative to the cometeries in Europe.



On the night of Aug. I2th Aikins volunteered to go out in front of our trenches at Fismette and carry in some wounded. He had only gone a short distance when a machine gum opened fire and Aikins was hit. He was dead when we reached him and we buried him in Fismette.





- (c) Any facts or circumstances or declarations tending to show whether the applicant intended to assume the obligation which a father would have in the matter of making provision for the support of the deceased soldier.
- (d) The manner in which, and the extent to which, the applicant actually provided for the deceased soldier while occupying the status in question.

Upon receipt of these affidavite your claim for the privilege of making the pilgrimage will be given due consideration. In replying, please advice the name, rank and organization of the deceased soldier.

It is regretted that reply could not be made sooner to your letter, but the delay has been due to the voluminous correspondence received incident to the pilgrimage of the Gold Star Methers and Widows to Europe and the investigation which had to be made in each case.


