



The records of this office indicate that you desire the remains of your husband, the late Private Willie Albrooks, Company "A", 332nd Labor Battalion, permanently interred in their present resting place in the American Cemetery at Rimaucourt, Department of Haute Marne. This is a temperary American cemetery and at the time of concentration of bodies, will be shanioned. The remains of soldiers interred therein, whose relatives have requested permanent interment abroad, will, according to present schedule, be transferred to the Belleau Wood American Cemetery at Bellanu, Department of Alane, where the graves will be perpetually cared for by the United States Government.
- 2. Should you prefer, the remains of your husband may be transferred to a nearby parament French cometery; in which event, it is requested that you execute and return to this office the enclosed release thereby relieving the United States Government of the future care of the grave. This release will not become effective until the body has been removed to the personent French commetery, at which time, you will be fully udvised of the new grave location and of the formal release of the remains.
- 5. In view of the above information, it is requested that you alvise this office whether you desire the remains of your husband transferred to a nearby permanent French cemetery or interred in the permanent American cometery in France, or returned to the United States either for private burial or interment in a national cometery in this country. In the event this advice is not received within a reasonable length of time, the body will be removed to the permanent American cometery in France.
