The records indicate that your son, the late Private Marien L. Alderton was 25 years of age when he calisted in the Army For service during the World War. There is a positive showing that he was not incapacitated oither mentally or physically at the time of his entry into the military service and that he was more than 21 years of age when he enlisted. 

If upon disinterment, effects are found upon bodies, they will be promptly ent to the Effects Depot direct, as is required by G. O. 170, G.H. 2, 1918., after being carefully examined for clues to identity in doubtful cases, notation whereof will be made and reported to Chief, G.R.S.
