Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of August 27, advising that you did not stand in loco parentis to your brother, the late Private Clinton O. Allard, and are not eligible to visit his grave at the expense of the Government.

There is no provision of law which would permit the next of kin to a deceased veteran to make this pilgrimage in the place of a mother or widow. Your desire to visit the last resting place of your brother is understood and appreciated. However I am sure you will realize the War Department has no alternative other than to carry out the law as passed by Congress.

Should a law at any time be enacted permitting the next of kin to a deceased veteran to make this pilgrimage in the place of a mother or widow, you will be promptly communicated with.


Reference is made to office letter of June 30, 1930, wherein you were requested to furnish affidavits in the event you considered yourself eligible to make a pilgrimage to the grave of the late Private Clinton O. Allard under the provisions of section 4 (a) of the Act of Congress of March 2, 1929, as amended, which reads in part "or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the deceased member of the military or naval forces for a period of not less than 5 years at any time prior to the soldier, sailor or marine becoming 18 years of age."

To date the affidavits have not been received and in order that the records may be completed, it is requested you advise whether or not you consider yourself eligible to make a pilgrimage under this provision of the law. A self-addressed envelope which requires no postage is enclosed for your convenience in replying.

In the event you consider yourself eligible and desire to make a pilgrimage, it is requested the affidavit forms sent you be completed by two persons not related to you and returned to this office. If you have misplaced the forms mentioned, another set will be mailed you upon request.

Dear Madam:

Information has been furnished this office which indicates that you may be eligible to make the pilgrimage to the grave of the late Clinton O. Allard under the provisions of the Act of Congress, approved March 2, 1929. Section 4 (a) of the Act was amended on May 15, 1930 so that it now reads in part as follows: "or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the deceased member of the military or naval forces for a period of not less than five years at any time prior to the soldier, sailor, or marine becoming 18 years of age."

In order to satisfy legal requirements it will be necessary for you to furnish as proof of your relationship, in loco parentis, the affidavits of at least two persons who are not related to you.

In the event you consider yourself eligible, under the law, to make the pilgrimage, it is requested that the enclosed form be completed and returned to this office in order that your eligibility may be determined. Under paragraphs 1 (a) and 1 (d), sufficient information should be included to permit an intelligible decision as to eligibility.

Dear Madam:

It is regretted that your letter of October 25, 1929, could not have been acknowledged before this. However, the voluminous amount of correspondence in this office incident to the Act of Congress of March 2, 1929, and the fact that an investigation must be made in each case has caused the delay.

It is believed that you have misunderstood the letter from this office of October 5, 1929, which was sent you relative to the Act above mentioned, authorizing pilgrimages to cemeteries in Europe of mothers and widows of deceased members of the American forces whose remains are now interred in such cemeteries. The only way you could make the pilgrimage at the expense of the Government, would be if you could qualify under the provisions of Section 4 (a) of the Act, which states in part "or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the deceased member of the military or naval forces for the year prior to the commencement of his service in such forces".

It has been held that within the meaning of the law a person cannot stand in loco parentis to an adult unless such adult is mentally or physically incapacitated. No man who was mentally or physically incapacitated was accepted for service in the military or naval forces. Inasmuch as your brother, the late Private Clinton O. Allard, Company B, 58th Infantry, who is buried in the Meuse Argonne American Cemetery in France, was an adult at the time of the commencement of his service, his age having been 23 years and 7 months, no person could have stood in loco parentis to him for the year prior to his entry into the service. Therefore, I regret to advise that you are ineligible within the meaning of the law, to make this pilgrimage at the expense of the Government.



