On the night of August 30th, 1918, at about 9:30 P.M., Pvt. Amitrano, woth about fifteen other men and myself, were coming from work near Pont St. Vincent, France. The men had been placing a derailed engine back on the track, and had then boarded flat cars loaded with sand, on which they were to return to the village. An air raid was made by the German flier, and one of the four bombs aimed at the minition plant nearby, struck a few yards from the car on which George Amitrano was riding. Numerous splinters from the bomb struck him, inflicting many wounds and causing great loss of blood. One splinter, striking him in the head, rendered him unconscious. He never regained consciousness. He was taken on a litter to a French Evacuation Hospital near Chaligny, France, a distance of about two kilometers from the scene of the explosion. He was attended by French surgeons; but about 1:30 A.M., August 31st 1918, he expired. The following day his body was taken to Pont St. Vincent, and after a short and impressive funeral service was escorted by the comrades of the deceased, to the edge of town. Burial was made in the American Cemetery adjoining the village of Menil-la-Tour, near Toul, France. A wreath purchased by the men of the Company was placed on the grave. He had shown unusual devotion to duty while on this special detail, and though it was desired to relieve him at 6:00 M.M., he refused to be relieved. preferring to finish the work which he had undertaken to do.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PROPER COMPLETION OF G. R. S. FORM NO. 16-A

Enter information, as noted below, on reverse side of sheet in the corresponding numbered space. This form is supplemental to and is to be forwarded with G. R. S. Form 1-a, reporting reburial locations. To be used in answer to Question 26, Form 114, in case no means of identification on body.

- 1. Show soldier's name, serial number, rank and organization, and by whom disinterred and reburied.
- 2. Give date and accurate information as to location from which the body was disinterred and the group and unit which made disinterment.
- 3. Give date and accurate information as to location of reburial and the group and unit which made reburial, and how reburial was made—in casket, wooden box, etc.
- 4. State to what degree decomposition has progressed, whether recognition is possible, and how the body was originally buried—in a casket, box, burlap, etc. This statement should be as complete as possible.
- 5. (a) State whether identification tags were found buried with body and on grave marker by reporting "Yes" or "No."
- (b) State whether or not body appears to have been a hospital case. Were any identifying articles found in or on body or grave? List any personal effects, letters, money-order receipts, and the like found on body or in grave. Give any and all information which it is thought might be of use in identifying the body, other than that tabulated under Item No. 6.
- 6. Give all information as to body description and dental chart as nearly correctly as the condition of the body will allow. Items (e) and (f) under the body description are very important and should be very complete. The dental chart is also very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found.
