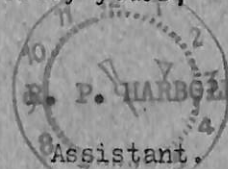
Dear Sir:

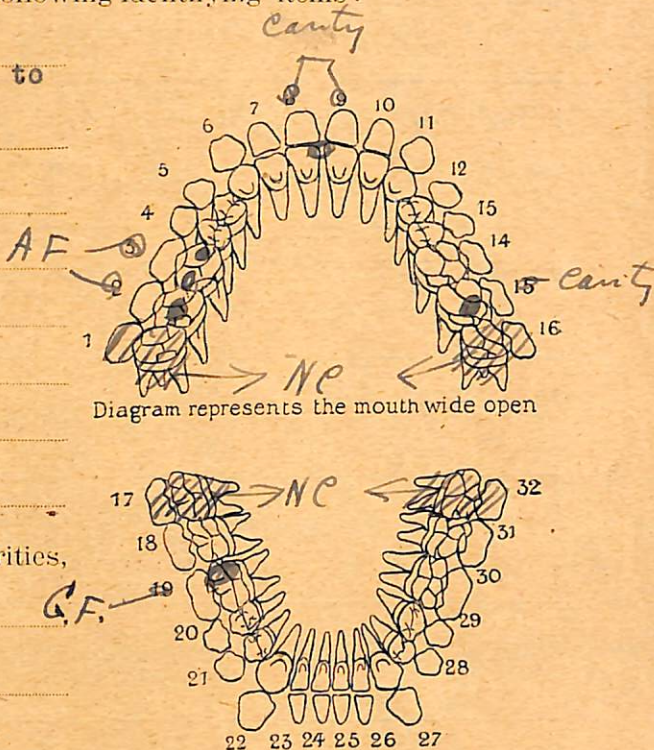

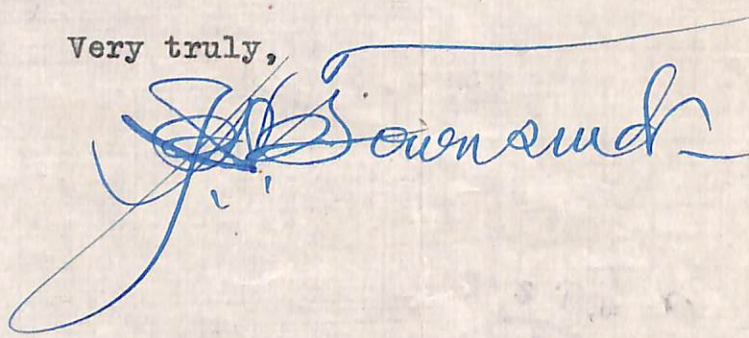
