The 16th Infantry was a unit of the Division which fought over the area in which the grave of the Unknown was found; further the co-ordinates of the Unknown's grave agree, as nearly as can be estimated, with those of Mechanic ANDERSON'S grave-location.
- 3. Paragraph 5 of the Form 16-A herewith, states that there was found "what was apparently a list of names," the list containing "the following names: 'J. Conn, L. Reed'. Enlisted man's collar ornament U.S. N.A. Initials 'C.F'! found on a piece of cloth." As applied to Mechanic ANDERSON, this could be explained by the fact that he was a Mechanic, in which case it would not seem unusual for him to have in his possession a list, or a partial list of the names of the men of his organization.
- 4. It is requested that the tooth chart and other data on the Form 16-A herewith be compared with that of Mechanic ANDERSON, with a view to establishing identity.


