1. The permanent grave of this soldier is No. 12 Row 11  
Block A, The American Cemetery of Suresnes, Department of Seine, France.

2. This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, organization and date of soldier's death. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

3. In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

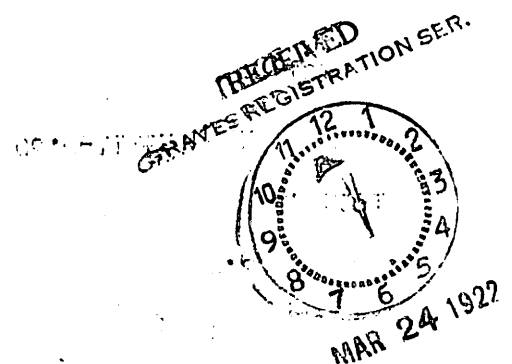

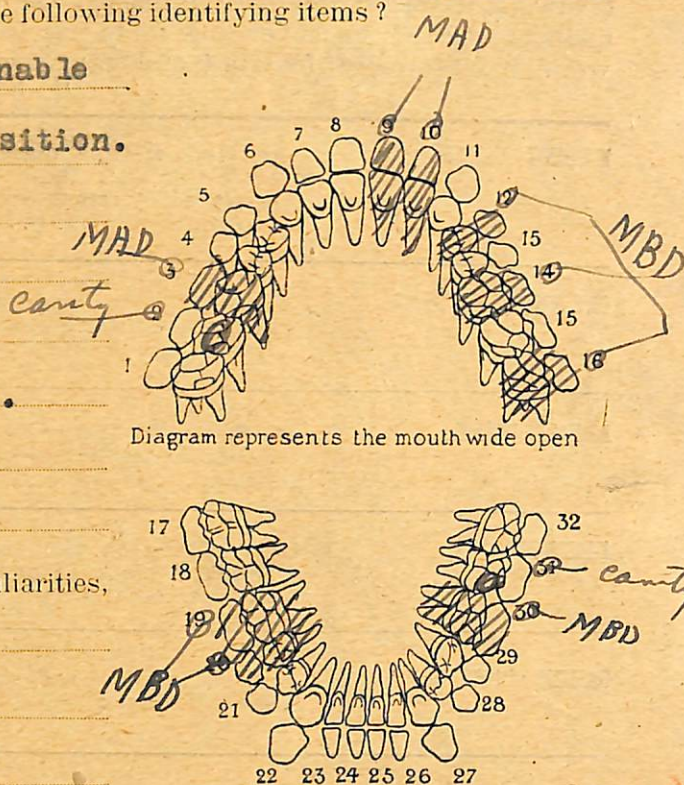

# INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PROPER COMPLETION OF G. R. S. FORM NO. 16-A

Enter information, as noted below, on reverse side of sheet in the *corresponding numbered space*. This form is supplemental to and is to be forwarded with G. R. S. Form 1-a, reporting reburial locations. To be used in answer to Question 26, Form 114, in case no means of identification on body.

1. Show soldier's name, serial number, rank and organization, and by whom disinterred and reburied.
2. Give date and accurate information as to location from which the body was disinterred and the group and unit which made disinterment.






3. Give date and accurate information as to location of reburial and the group and unit which made reburial, and how reburial was made—in casket, wooden box, etc.

4. State to what degree decomposition has progressed, whether recognition is possible, and how the body was originally buried—in a casket, box, burlap, etc. This statement should be as complete as possible.

5. (a) State whether identification tags were found buried with body and on grave marker by reporting "Yes" or "No".

(b) State whether or not body appears to have been a hospital case. Were any identifying articles found in or on body or grave? List any personal effects, letters, money-order receipts, and the like found on body or in grave. An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found.

SUBJECT: Disposition of remains.

1. In reply to your letter of September 5, 1920, you are advised that your request that the remains of your son, Private Ernest Anderson, Company "C", 111th Machine Gun Battalion, be permanently interred in France, has been noted and instructions have been issued that your wishes be complied with.

2. The records of this office show that the body of your son is buried in grave #112, American Cemetery at Limoges, Department of Haute Vienne. Inasmuch as this cemetery is only a temporary American cemetery it must necessarily be abandoned at some future date. At that time the remains of your son will be disinterred and reburied in one of the permanent American fields of honor in France. When this has been effected you will be notified of the new location of the grave.

3. The records of the Photographic Section of the American Red Cross, attached to this office, show that three copies of the photograph of the grave of your son have been sent to you at 14 Boras, Goteborg, Sweden. If you have not received these photographs it is suggested that you write this office. There is no appropriation available for furnishing the relatives of our soldier dead with photographs of the cemeteries.

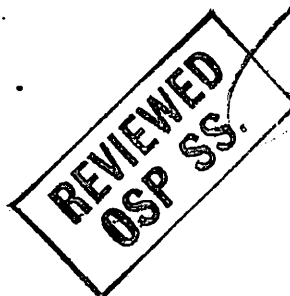

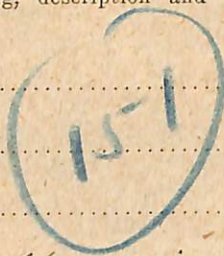

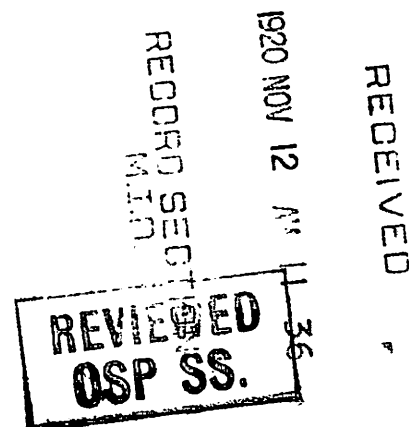

SUBJECT: Disposition of remains.

1. In reply to your letter of September 5, 1920, you are advised that your request that the remains of your son, Private Ernest Anderson, Company "C", 11th Machine Gun Battalion, be permanently interred in France, has been noted and instructions have been issued that your wishes be complied with.

2. The records of this office show that the body of your son is buried in grave #112, American Cemetery at Limoges, Department of Haute Vienne. Inasmuch as this cemetery is only a temporary American cemetery it must necessarily be abandoned at some future date. At that time the remains of your son will be disinterred and reburied in one of the permanent American fields of honor in France. When this has been effected you will be notified of the new location of the grave.

3. The records of the Photographic Section of the American Red Cross, attached to this office, show that three copies of the photograph of the grave of your son have been sent to you at 14 Boras, Gothenborg, Sweden. If you have not received these photographs it is suggested that you write this office. There is no appropriation available for furnishing the relatives of our soldier dead with photographs of the cemeteries.

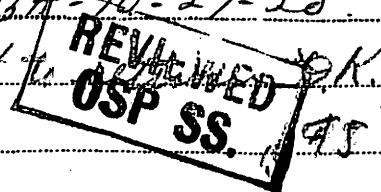

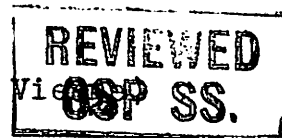
