Receipt is acknowledged of the form letter from this office dated August 30, 1929, completed by you, furnishing information requested in connection with the Gold Star Mothers' and Widows' Pilgrimage to Europe, authorized by the Act of Congress of March 2, 1929.

Your attention is invited to Section 2 (g) of the Act which states in part "Suitable transportation, accommodations, meals, and other necessities pertaining thereto, \* \* shall be furnished each mother or widow included in any pilgrimage \* \* while enroute in the United States from home to port and from port to home". In view of the fact that the Act clearly implies that only residents of the United States are eligible to make the pilgrimage at the expense of the Government, I regret to advise you that your mother is not eligible to visit the grave of her son, the late Private John Anderson who is buried in the Meuse Argonne American Cemetery in France, at the expense of the United States.

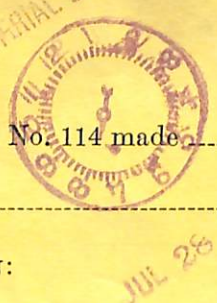

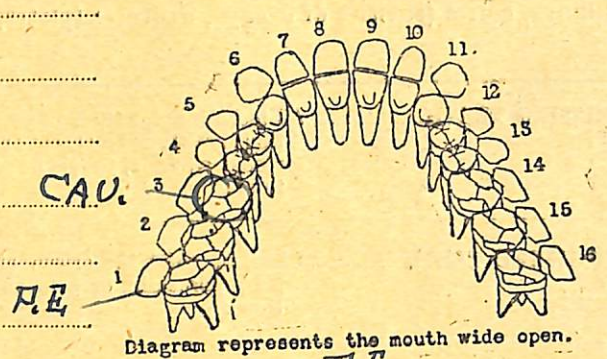
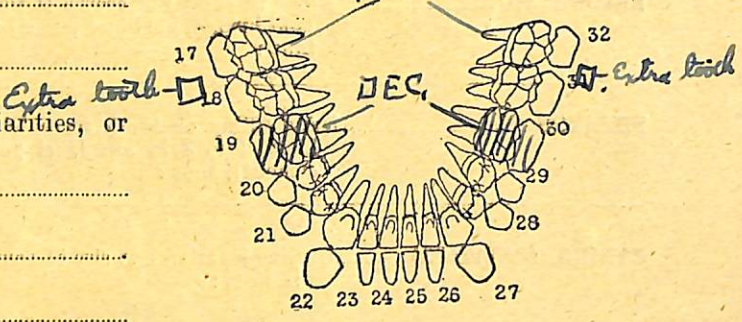


Diagram represents the mouth wide open.

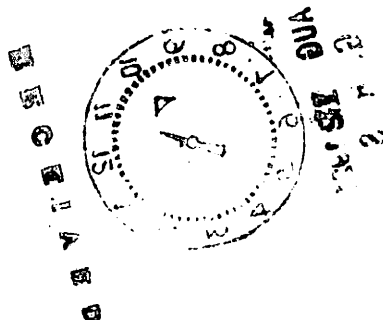

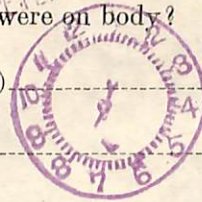

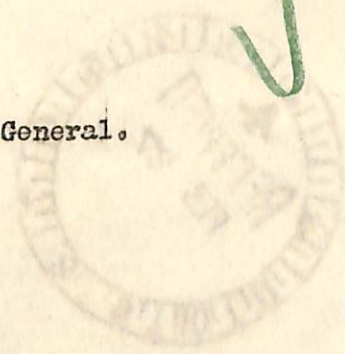
