



INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PROPER COMPLETION OF G. R. S. FORM NO. 16-A

Enter information, as noted below, on reverse side of sheet in the *corresponding numbered space*. This form is supplemental to and is to be forwarded with G. R. S. Form 1-a, reporting reburial locations. To be used in answer to Question 26, Form 114, in case no means of identification on body.

1. Show soldier's name, serial number, rank and organization, and by whom disinterred and reburied.
2. Give date and accurate information as to location from which the body was disinterred and the group and unit which made disinterment.
3. Give date and accurate information as to location of reburial and the group and unit which made reburial, and how reburial was made—in casket, wooden box, etc.
4. State to what degree decomposition has progressed, whether recognition is possible, and how the body was originally buried—in a casket, box, burlap, etc. This statement should be as complete as possible.
5. (a) State whether identification tags were found buried with body and on grave marker by reporting "Yes" or "No".

(b) State whether or not body appears to have been a hospital case. Were any identifying articles found in or on body or grave? List any personal effects, letters, money-order receipts, and the like found on body or in grave. Give any and all information which it is thought might be of use in identifying the body, other than that tabulated under Item No. 6.

6. Give all information as to body description and dental chart as nearly correctly as the condition of the body will allow. Items (e) and (f) under the body description are very important and should be very complete. The dental chart is also very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspid (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found.

MISSING TEETH.....All teeth missing through previous extraction (not those fractured or displaced by recent wounds) should be scratched out, thus:



CROWNED TEETH.....Block in solid the crown of tooth (label gold, porcelain, or gold and porcelain), thus:




BRIDGE WORK.....Block in solid the crown of tooth (label gold bridge, gold and porcelain bridge), thus:



FILLINGS.....Draw filling on tooth accurately as possible (block in and label gold, silver, cement), thus:



CARIES (CAVITIES).....Outline location and size of cavity, shade in thus:



DENTURES (PLATES).....Draw diagram of relative size and shape of plate, block in teeth attached and indicate retaining clasps on natural teeth with the word "clasp."

1. Replying to your letter of May 17, in which you state that you understand that the residents of Carbon Blanc (Gironde), France, have pledged themselves to care for and to decorate the graves in the American cemetery at this place as an exhibition of their sympathy and friendship toward our dead, and requesting the name of the person who may be particularly caring for the grave of Master Engineer, Sr.Gr., Lewis E. Anderson, Headquarters Company, 15th Engineers, I have to advise you that this matter is not officially within the jurisdiction of this Service. While there is no objection on the part of the Graves Registration Service to permitting French ladies to care for the graves of Americans, should they so desire, this office is not in a position to supply you with the name of any person who may be assigned to or may be caring for the grave of this soldier. The Graves Registration Service, in whose custody the remains of our deceased soldiers overseas have been placed, is bending every effort to see that the graves of our fallen soldiers are amply and equally cared for out of Government funds provided for this purpose. Any care or attention that is given the graves of Americans by French civilians must be done with the distinct understanding that such care is subject to the regulations concerning the arrangements and care of the American Expeditionary Force's cemeteries, especially as regards the planting of flowers and shrubs.

2. You may rest assured that this Service will exert every effort to see that the grave of Master Engineer Anderson and the many other graves of his fallen comrades in France receive every care and attention within our power.
