GENERAL INFORMATION REGARDING THE PILGRIMAGE

And Iff year want any information

The entire cost of the Pilgrimage from the time you leave your home until you return thereto will be borne by the United States Government. You will need money only for the purchase of any small articles of a personal nature you may desire to obtain as souvenirs.

Should you decide to make the trip, a formal invitation will be extended you, setting forth the name of the vessel and the date of sailing. If you accept the invitation, an identification badge will be forwarded you shortly before you leave home to wear while on the journey. The wearing of this badge assures you every attention, the railroad personnel rendering special care and assistance to the wearers of this emblem. Your local railroad agent will deliver your Pullman and railroad tickets to you about a week before you leave home, and you will be furnished a detailed schedule of your trip to New York. A check to cover the cost of your meals and incidental expenses to New York will be sent you about two weeks prior to leaving.

Upon arrival in New York you will be met at the station by an officer of the United States Army who will escort you to the hotel at which reservation has been made for you. From that time on you will be under the personal supervision of Army officers and any expenditures that are necessary will be taken care of by them. Competent personnel to care for your comfort and welfare throughout the trip will be provided and doctors and nurses will be available. When you return to New York from Europe, you will be given railroad and Pullman tickets to your home, together with a check to pay for meals and other expenses on the journey, and you will be escorted to the train by an officer.

Somewhat heavier clothing is required in Europe during the summer than is necessary in the United States, and the pilgrims are requested to provide themselves with slightly heavier and warmer clothing than they ordinarily wear at home. That is, at least two pairs of comfortable shoes to provide a change in the event your feet become wet, a pair of rubbers, an umbrella, a full length coat for general wear, and a sweater or some warm wrap to be used should the weather become uncomfortably cool.

The pilgrimage was authorized by Congress in an endeavor to bring a measure of solace and peace to the hearts of the mothers and widows whose loved ones gave their lives in their Country's cause, and it is evident from the many letters received from women who have made the journey that the effort has not been in vain. Approximately six thousand mothers and widows, many of whom were in very poor health and of advanced age, successfully made the pilgrimage during the summers of 1930, 1931 and 1932. The pilgrimages of 1930 and 1931 have been completed, that of 1932 is under way, and arrangements are now being made for conducting the last of these pilgrimages during the summer months of 1933.






