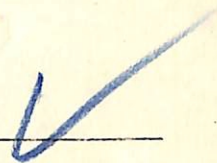

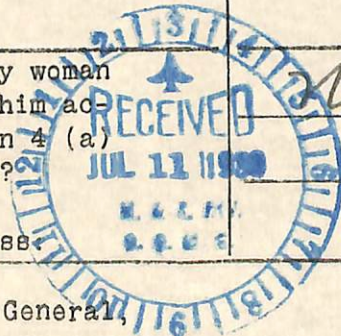

The Quartermaster General desires that you be informed that the permanent grave of the late Pvt. 1/c Clair Ferris Andrews, Co. B, 307th. Infantry is Grave 34, Row 42, Block E, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery at Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Dept. of Meuse, France. This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

Missing July 21st 1918.

I was one of the men who went with Capt. Barrett on the afternoon raid. Baccarat Sector, Lorraine front, on that date. It was pulled off without any barrage. The idea was to capture prisoners. There were two officers, the captain and second lieutenant and about fifty men. The lieutenant was wounded and the capt, killed (See Lipman's report on Capt. Barrett for full description)

An drews was one of the men who went on the raid. I do not know what happened to him.

" We took a village called St. Maurice on the Lorraine front along the middle of July. The village had been gassed, and got it in my lungs and eyes, so they sent me back to a hospital at Saccarst, and I didn't go over the top with the other fellows and all I know is just what was told me. There was a machine gun nest near us, and 52 fellows volunteered to go over the top July 20-21 and get it, and only 17 come back, and they was pretty well tore up with wire and shell, and got sent back to my hospital, and they told me that Andrews didn't come back. One of the fellows who got back was Harry Swartz, and Donnelly was another another, James or John his name is, I think James. They could tell you more. They said the Boches kept up such a barrage that the men couldn't go back to get the wounded. But they could see the German hospital trucks going back and forth, and they think the Germans took our wounded fellows to their hospital. Later, some German prisoners had the identity disks of some of our fellows they had buried, but I didn't hear of Andrews being in the lot. This Andrews in our company was from Kingsham Binghampton, had black hair, and wore eye-glasses, and was the only Andrews. I don't know his first name. The ground was held."

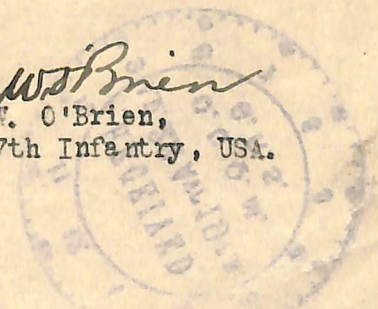





2. Upon completion of an extensive investigation for the purpose of discovering the exact location of the grave of the officer and soldiers to whom reference is made above, it is the opinion of this office that their bodies are buried in French Civilian Cemetery #1328, Cirey-sur-Venouse, Meurthe-et-Moselle, and Form 1-A covering the burials in this Cemetery shows fifteen unknown Americans to be buried in Grave #12 and the body of an unknown American officer to be contained in Grave #13, and unknown American soldiers to be buried in Graves #2 - 3 - 6 - 7 - 16 and 21.

3. The body descriptions and dental charts of the officer and soldiers to whom reference is made afford the following information:

CAPTAIN BARRETT -- Age at enlistment -- 27 years, 6 months; Color of eyes -- hazel; Color of hair -- blonde; Height -- 6 feet; Weight -- 133 pounds. Teeth O.K. No additional information can be obtained relative to the description of the teeth of this officer.

PRIVATE BORKER -- Age at enlistment -- 25 years, 11 months; Color of eyes -- blue; Color of hair -- brown; Height -- 5 feet, 2-1/2 inches; Weight -- 121 pounds. The following tooth was missing on date of enlistment -- lower right #6, and information received from the father of this soldier is to the effect that he remembers Private Borker having had some fillings and crowns but no bridges.

Physical report of examination prior to enlistment shows - no record of any teeth missing. The following additional information was furnished this office by the mother of Private 1st Class Charles in reply to a letter of inquiry from this office: " His head was of abnormal size, as his skull at the base protruded half an inch more than an ordinary skull would and he had to wear a 7 or 7-1/8 hat. His nose had the cartilage bone cut out when he was about 15 years old and he also received a very bad smash upon his left cheek bone while playing football. I know that he had one gold crown and several fillings.

4. It is requested that the bodies contained in Graves #2 - 3 - 6 - 7 - 12 13 - 16 and 21 be disinterred in an effort to ascertain the exact location of the grave of the soldiers to which reference is made above from the information contained herein. Forms 16-A, carefully accomplished, covering these disinterments and reburials to be submitted to this office, together with a report of action taken and results obtained.
