

Your attention is invited to the enclosed copy of an Act of Congress approved March 2, 1929, entitled an Act "To enable the mothers and widows of the deceased soldiers, sailors and marines of the American forces now interred in the cemeteries of Europe to make a pilgrimage to these cemeteries".

The records of this office show that you are the uncle of the late Private John Andronievicz, Co. C, 61st Inf., whose remains are now interred in the Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, Remagne-sous-Montfaucon, Meuse, France.

Will you please advise this office whether or not he is survived by a mother or widow who is entitled under the provisions of the above quoted Act, to make the pilgrimage, and if so, will you please furnish the full names and addresses of the mother and widow in order that action may be taken to extend invitations to them to make the pilgrimage. Both mothers and widows are entitled to make the pilgrimage.

Your attention is particularly invited to Section 4 of the enclosed Act, which defines the terms "mother" and "widow". If the relative is a stepmother, mother through adoption, or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the decedent, a statement as to her relationship is requested. If he was survived by a widow who has since remarried it is also requested that a statement to that effect be made.





Diagram represents the mouth wide open.


On March 16th and June 6th 1921, this Service communicated with you requesting an expression of your desire as to the final disposition of the remains of your late son, Pvt. John Androzeiviez, #2386483 Co.C. 61st Inf., who is buried in Cem.#345 Raon l'Etape, Vosges, France.

Up to the present time no reply has been received and you are again informed that the American Government is prepared to bury these remains:

- (a) In a National Cemetery in the United States; or
- (b) Concentrate the remains for permanent burial in a permanent American Cemetery in France; or
- (c) Transport the remains to your address, at the expense of the U.S. Government, for final interment, provided the health regulations and sanitary laws will permit the entry of the remains, and provided the deceased was, for a period of time prior to his enlistment in the U.S. Army, a resident of the city, town or neighborhood in which you live; or, if he was not a resident of the place at which you now live, this service will transport the remains to such place at which he was a resident. Burial expenses to be borne by you.

It is requested that you return this letter with your wishes clearly indicated thereon, so that we may have a record as to your preference, and in the event that you wish the remains shipped to you or some other place under the conditions referred to in (c), the attached affidavit should be taken before an official in your commune, properly authorized to administer oaths, sworn to and sealed and returned to this office together with your reply.
