

The decision of the Secretary of War that no requests for removal of bodies will be considered after March 31st, 1922 will preclude the granting of a request from the father should one later be submitted.
- The grave will be marked by a suitable headstone and will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a most careful and reverent manner.
