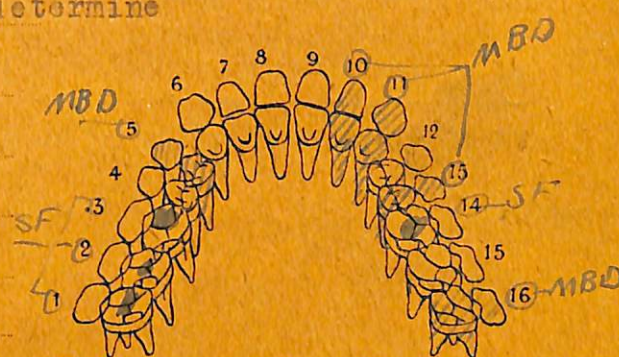
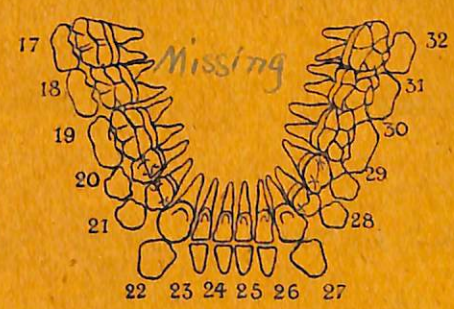


Diagram represents the mouth wide open

8. Show name of person supervising the reburial and the name and title of the person approving same.
