On Sept. 5 1918 at 1 PM our Company advanced over a hill north of Corlandon. Meeting heavy machine gun fire we dug in. Pvt Atriano was hit in the head by a bullet. He was immediately carried to the dressing station but died in about a half hour. He was buried on the same hillside by Chaplain Conaty.

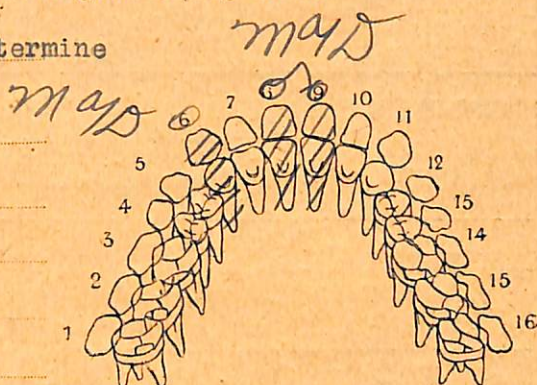
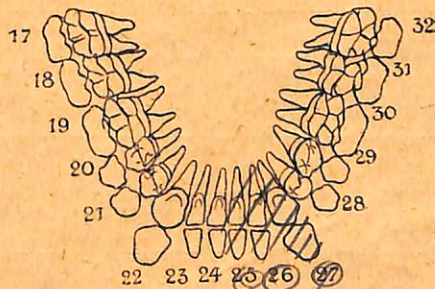


Diagram represents the mouth wide open
