The Finance Service will pay escort a per diem allowance, in advance, at the authorized rate (4 rations plus \$1.50) for two and one-fourth ($2\frac{1}{4}$) days, as provided in paragraph 1223-(g), Army Regulations, it being impracticable for the Government to furnish subsistence in kind. 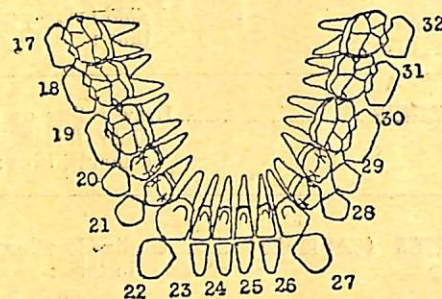
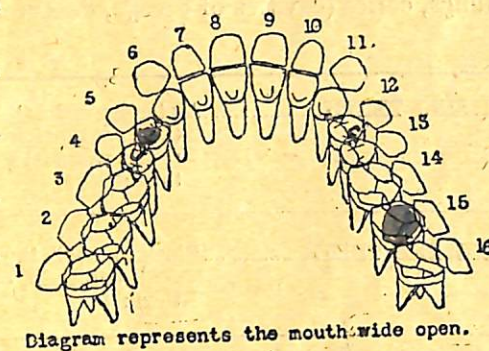
