Receipt is acknowledged of the affidavits you submitted to this office to substantiate your claim as having stood in loco parentis to your brother, the late Private Philip G. Arnet, in order that your eligibility to make a pilgrimage to his grave under the provisions of the Act of Congress of March 2, 1929, as amended May 15, 1930, might be determined.

It has been held that in order for a woman to be eligible under the loco parentis clause of the Act mentioned above, she must have provided the deceased veteran with food, clothing, shelter, guidance, counsel, etc., thus taking the part of a father for a period of not less than five years at any time prior to the veteran's reaching the age of eighteen.

In view of the fact that the father of the late Private Arnet was living at the time you claim to have stood in loco parentis to your brother, and there is no evidence to show that he did not provide for his son during that period, it is regretted to advise that you are not eligible within the meaning of the law to make a pilgrimage to Europe at the expense of the Government.

Your desire to visit the last resting place of your brother is understood and appreciated, but you will realize that the War Department has no alternative other than to carry out the law as passed by Congress.

This office is in receipt of information which indicates that you may be eligible to make the pilgrimage to the grave of the late Philip G. Arnet, under the provisions of the Act of March 2, 1929, as amended on May 15, 1930.

In this connection you are informed that Section 4 (a) of the Act has been amended to read in part as follows: " or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the deceased member of the military or naval forces for a period of not less than five years at any time prior to the soldier, sailor, or marine becoming eighteen years of age."

In order to satisfy the legal requirements, it will be necessary for you to furnish as proof of the relationship claimed (in loco parentis) the affidavits of at least two persons not related to you.

Receipt is acknowledged of the form letter from this office of August 27, 1929, completed by you, furnishing information requested in connection with the Gold Star Mothers' and Widows' Pilgrimage to Europe, authorized by the Act of March 2, 1929.

It is noted you desire the privilege of making this pilgrimage for your daughter, Miss Elsie E. Arnet, under the provisions of Section 4 (a) of the Act, which states in part "or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the deceased member of the military or naval forces for the year prior to the commencement of his service in such forces".

It has been held that within the meaning of the law a person cannot stand in loco parentis to an adult unless such adult is mentally or physically incapacitated. No man who was mentally or physically incapacitated was accepted for service in the military or naval forces. Inasmuch as Private Philip G. Arnet was an adult at the time of the commencement of his service, his age having been 22 years and 5 months, no person could have stood in loco parentis to him for the year prior to his entry into the service. Therefore, I regret to advise that Miss Arnet is ineligible, within the meaning of the law, to make this pilgrimage at the expense of the Government.
