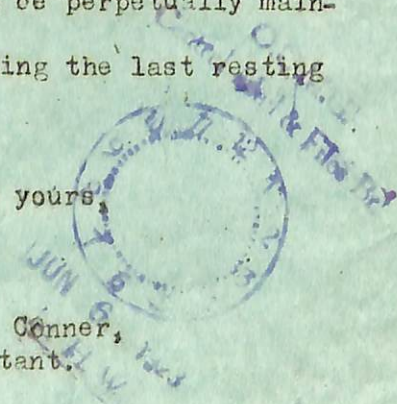
This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries

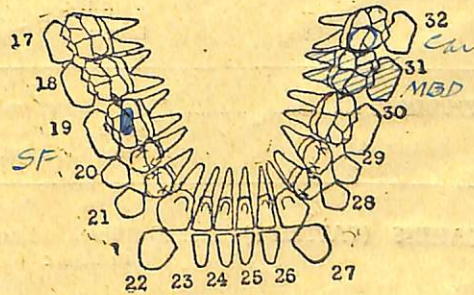
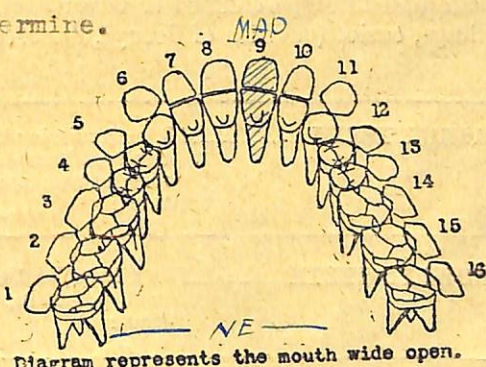
