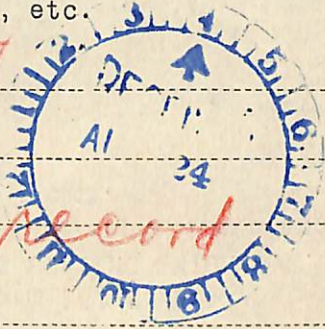

In reply to your letter of May 1, 1919 received in this office from France you are advised that the records of this office show that Private Antonio Arrigo, Company A., 319th Infantry, Serial No. 2707972, was killed in action September 27, 1918 and his remains were buried October 2, 1918 in Commune Gercourt-et-Driencourt, Department of Meuse, were disinterred and reburied in Grave #152, Section 25, Plot 3, Argonne American Cemetery, Romagne-Sous-Montfaucon, Department of Meuse.

2. On account of conflicting reports received in this office our former letter to you showed the rank of this soldier to be that of Corporal. The matter has been taken up with the Adjutant General of the Army and it has been found that the records of the War Department show that at the time of his death Antonio Arrigo was a Private in Company A., 319th Infantry. If further information is desired in regard to this matter it is requested that the matter be taken up with the Adjutant General of the Army, direct.

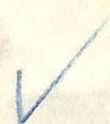

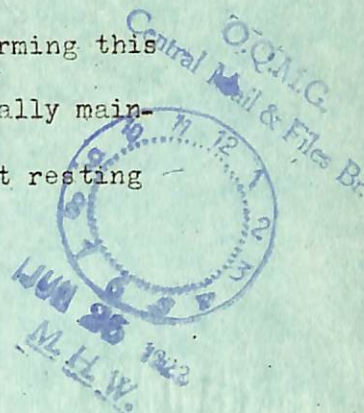

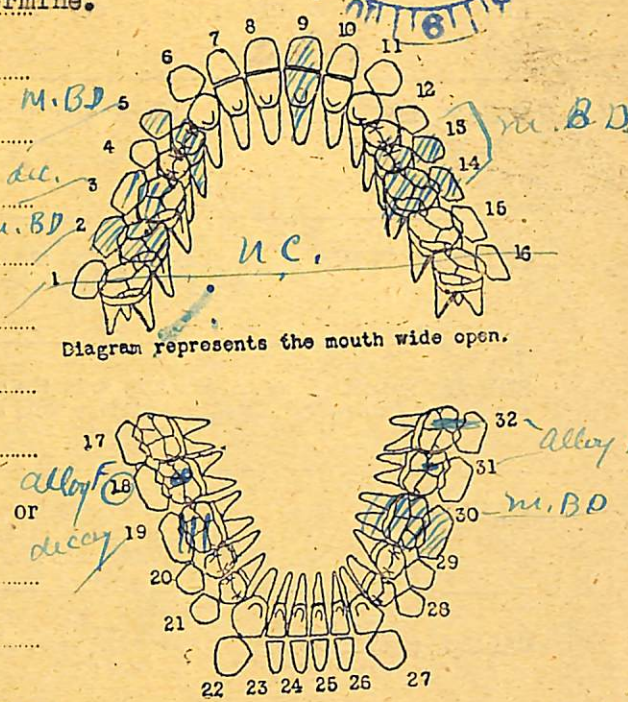

In reply to your letter of May 1, 1919 received in this office from France you are advised that the records of this office show that Private Antonio Arrigo, Company A., 319th Infantry, Serial No. 2707972, was killed in action September 27, 1918 and his remains were buried October 2, 1918 in Commune Gercourt-et-Drillancourt, Department of Meuse, were disinterred and reburied in Grave #152, Section 25, Plot 3, Argonne American Cemetery, Romagne-Sous-Montfaucon, Department of Meuse.

2. On account of conflicting reports received in this office our former letter to you showed the rank of this soldier to be that of Corporal. The matter has been taken up with the Adjutant General of the Army and it has been found that the records of the War Department show that at the time of his death Antonio Arrigo was a Private in Company A., 319th Infantry. If further information is desired in regard to this matter it is requested that the matter be taken up with the Adjutant General of the Army, direct.

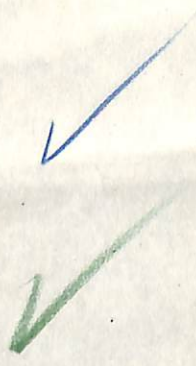

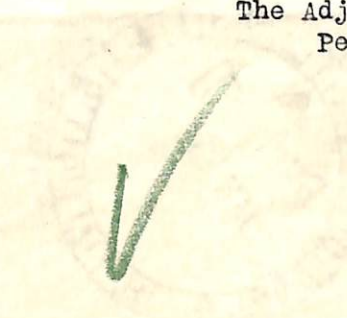
