



Diagram represents the mouth wide open.

Dear Madam:

The American Government is undertaking to remove the bodies of its soldiers who died in the late war to such places as the relatives may desire and accordingly you are requested to advise whether you wish the body of your late son, Private Carl Aasland, Company E, 343rd Infantry, United States Army, to remain buried in France, in the care and custody of the United States, or delivered to you for reburial in Norway, or returned to the United States and placed in the National Cemetery at Arlington, Virginia, where the grave is assured constant care by the American Government. This Government bears all expense in connection with the removal of the body.

Should you desire to have the body removed to Norway for reburial such transfer will be subject to the health regulations and sanitation laws of France and Norway, and any intervening countries through which the body may have to pass en route, and should the operation of such instrumentalities prevent the removal of the body in the manner desired, it will remain in the care and custody of the American Graves Registration Service in Europe and will be cared for under the supervision of this Government.



1. Arrived at Le Havre, France, at 6:10 PM, May 25, on the SS President Harding, in charge of Capt. John O'Daniel, Inf., and Lt. Russell J. Nelson, Inf., and was met by Lt. Col. R.H. Jordan, Q.M.C. Left Le Havre at 6:56 PM and arrived at the Gare des Invalides at 10:48 PM. De-trained and spent the night at the Hotel D'Iena.
2. Friday, May 26, the morning was taken up with conferences with the Conducting Officers. Lunch was eaten at the hotel and she visited Sacre Coeur in the afternoon.






