" I was present shortly after Private Babinski ; John 3I84897 was shot supposedly by Private Howell , George W. Ordnance Detachment , 6th Train Hqs . near Detachment mess . Aignay le Duc , Côte d'Or, France . December 25th 1918 . I witnessed the wounds received ? Private Howell was tried for murder of Pvt. Babibski . The findings and sentence of the court have not been published to this date ? Evidence showed Babinski the innocent victim of a shot fired at him while in performance of his military duty .

Babinski Hospital records show that Private Babinski , John 3I84897 died of gun shot wound 5.00 A.M. December 26th 1918 . Buried in American Camp Cemetery about one mile north of Recey-sur-Ource , Côte d'Or, France. "

For the future, these graves will be perpetually maintained by the Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

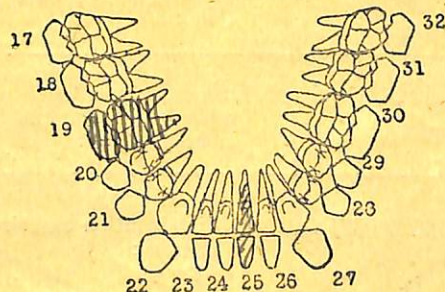
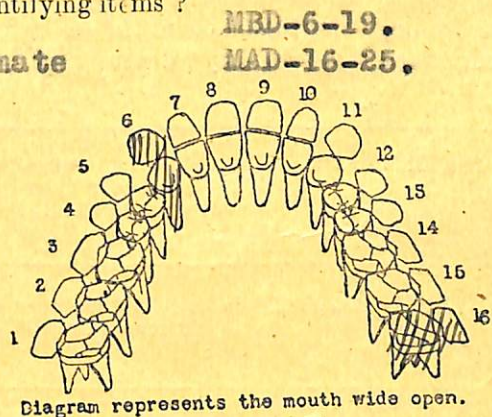
