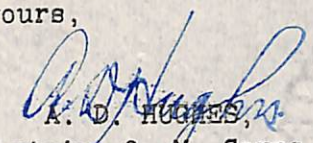

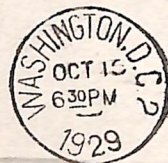

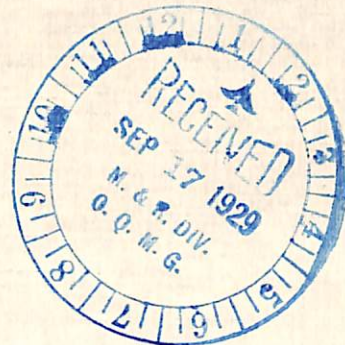

Dear Sir, The Quartermaster General desires that you be informed that the permanent grave of

Private Edmund Baggs, Company K, 129th Infantry, is Grave 29, Row 40, Block B, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, Romagne-sous-Montfaucon (Meuse), France.

This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, division, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

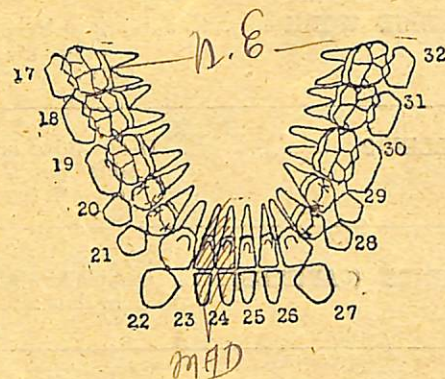
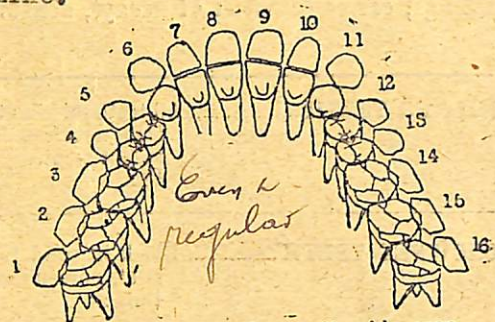

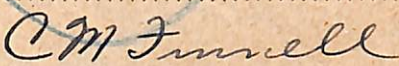

BAGGS was hit by a snipers bullet Oct. 11, 1918 about 7:30 A.M. in the edge of the woods just ahead of Consenvoye, France, bullet struck and entered his forehead above the right eye, BAGGS did not talk after being hit as we told him to remain quiet and we would get him out of there in just a moment. He was evacuated in less than ten minutes. Father Howe was attached to the 129th. Inf. told me that BAGGS had died and was buried 3 days later.
