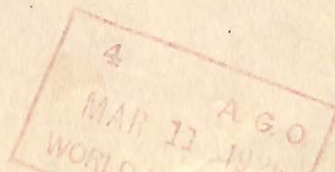

Dear Madam:

The Quartermaster General desires that you be informed that the permanent grave of the late Private James Bain, Company D, 315th Infantry, is Grave 17, Row 3, Block B, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Department of Meuse, France.

This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

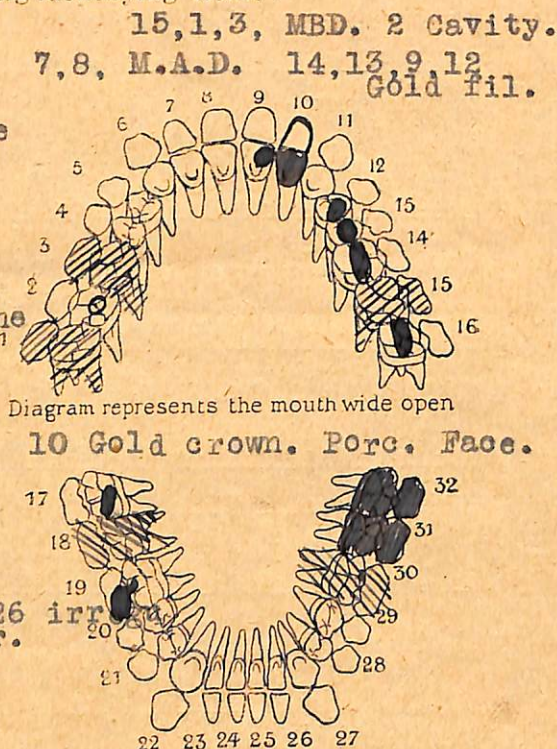

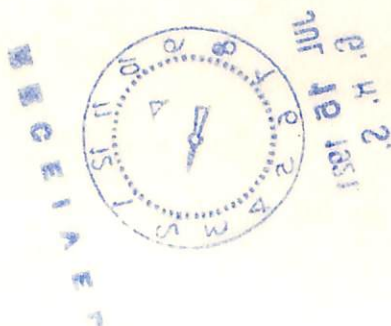

In reply to your letter of January 24th, 1919, in respect to the place of burial of the above-mentioned soldier, I have to inform you that, according to the records at these headquarters, Private James Bain died of wounds received in action, and his body was interred in GRAVE #30, ROW #90, in the FRENCH CEMETERY of "GLORIEUX" at VERDUN, in the Department of the MEUSE. His Grave is marked by the regulation Cross with identification tag attached.

2. This information has not as yet been confirmed by my officers in the field, but there is very little doubt that the grave is situated in the cemetery above named.
