



Diagram represents the mouth wide open

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PROPER COMPLETION OF G. R. S. FORM NO. 16-A

Enter information, as noted below, on reverse side of sheet in the corresponding numbered space. This form is supplemental to and is to be forwarded with G. R. S. Form 1-a, reporting reburial locations. To be used in answer to Question 26, Form 114, in case no means of identification on body.

1. Show soldier's name, serial number, rank and organization, and by whom disinterred and reburied.
 2. Give date and accurate information as to location from which the body was disinterred and the group and unit which made disinterment.

3. Give date and accurate information as to location of reburial and the group and unit which made reburial, and how reburial was made—in casket, wooden box, etc.

4. State to what degree decomposition has progressed, whether recognition is possible, and how the body was originally buried—in a casket, box, burlap, etc. This statement should be as complete as possible.

5. (a) State whether identification tags were found buried with body and on grave marker by reporting "Yes" or "No".

(b) State whether or not body appears to have been a hospital case. Were any identifying articles found in or on body or grave? List any personal effects, letters, money-order receipts, and the like found on body or in grave. Give any and all information which it is thought might be of use in identifying the body, other than that tabulated under Item No 6.

6. Give all information as to body description and dental chart as nearly correctly as the condition of the body will allow. Items (e) and (f) under the body description are very important and should be very complete. The dental chart is also very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found.

All teeth missing through previous extraction (not those fractured or displaced by recent wounds) should be scratched out, thus:



The Quartermaster General desires you to be advised that the investigation which has been conducted with a view to locating the grave containing the remains of your late brother, Pvt. 1st cl. Zygmunt Baranski, Co. A, 1st Brigade, Machine Gun Battalion, has been successfully concluded- the remains having been identified in Grave 10, Row 24, Block C, Somme American Cemetery, Bony, Department of Aisne, France.

There is on file a request made by you to the effect that you desired the remains returned to this country for private interment, and as sometime has elapsed since you filed the request, this letter is to inquire as to whether you still wish the return effected. Should it still be your desire that the remains be returned, this office is unable to state definitely at the present time as to when the particular case of your brother will be reached, as the Army Transport Service between this country and Europe has been discontinued and shipments will now have to be made by commercial or naval vessels at such times as can be arranged for.

In the event you do not now wish the remains returned, they may rest permanently in the Somme American Cemetery, where you are assured perpetual care of the grave by this Government.

While it is not the policy of the Department to attempt to influence relatives in their decision, it is always gratified to receive their consent to leaving the graves of their soldier dead in its care. We are thereby enabled to fittingly honor our comrades who gave their lives for the Nation, and this solemn duty will continue to be performed so long as this Government endures. If agreeable to you, this office will be glad to receive your permission for final burial among the comrades with whom this late soldier served and where his grave will be tenderly cared for by a grateful Nation.

Kindly advise this office as soon as possible regarding your final wishes; using the inclosed envelope, which requires no postage, for your reply.


